

# Community steps up to support victims and survivors of drug abuse at Walk for Addiction

TILTON — For the third year in a row, the Winnisquam community gathered to show their support for those who face addiction or have lost loved ones to the ongoing drug epidemic through the Walk For Addiction, held on May 6 at Winnisquam Regional High School.

Tilton Police Chief Robert Cormier said his department once again hosted this year's walk in their attempt to raise awareness about the impact drugs have had locally. New this year was a Memory Wall, depicting those lost tragically through drugs.

"This is all about

showing our support for families and people who are fighting addiction and showing them places they can find resources for assistance," Cormier. "We want people to know that the police departments and the community are behind them. We're going to do everything we can to break this cycle of addiction and make families whole again."

This year's benefactors of donations and raffles for the walk were Hope For N.H. Recovery in Franklin and the Teen Challenge program, each offering assistance, support and options available to those affected by addiction. Both organi-

TILTON — The 800 block of Route 3 in Tilton, near the Lord Hampshire

Resort, was the scene of a serious multi-vehicle accident at approximately 10 a.m. on Monday, May 8. The incident resulted

in several injuries and shut down the busy roadway for more than two hours as rescue operations removed three vic-

tims from the scene and investigators looked into the cause of the crash.

TILTON — Tilton-Northfield Rotary's Free Children's Fishing Derby will be held on Sunday, May 21, and members of the Rotary

would like to invite all children from infants to the age of 15 to enjoy a fun time where prizes, trophies and food will enhance the fishing excitement even more this year.

Don Carpenter is leading the way for the 2017 derby, and said there will be one small change this time around. In the past children could catch as many fish as they were able but now they will be subjected to a four fish limit.

"Fish and Game wouldn't donate any fish to the derby without having that limit set, and really, it's a good way to teach kids how to fish properly and learn the laws governing the sport," said Carpenter.

That doesn't mean "catch and release" won't come into play, though. Those who reel in a small fish and want to try for a bigger entry

into the derby can safely return the fish to the pond and keep on casting.

New Hampshire Fish and Game will be donating 250 brook trout and rainbow trout for the event. Rotary will also purchase an additional 250 fish of the two species from Hy-On-A-Hill Trout Farm to make certain there are plenty of fish available in the pond that day.

Once again, Health First Family Care of Franklin and Laconia will also be pitching in to add some excitement to the day with a special raffle. As each child registers for the derby, they

## Several departments called to battle Lochmere fire

TILTON — An alert citizen walking a dog at a little after 5 a.m. on May 5 discovered a fire at 3 C St., just off Lakewood Drive in the Lochmere District of Tilton, which ultimately

resulted in a two-alarm blaze when the flames began to spread through a tightly knit neighborhood comprised of both year round and seasonal homes.

Tilton-Northfield firefighters were initially toned to 35 Lakewood Drive in Tilton, but when they responded to the call, they found the fire to actually be located on a small lane just off that road.

Chief Michael Sitar said that upon their arrival there was heavy fire showing from a home on nearby C Street with exposure of flames

## STRATEGIES FOR LIVING

Following Jesus' resurrection, Matthew, one of Jesus' disciples, tells us that "the eleven disciples went to ... the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted." Come again? After all they had experienced with Jesus, they doubted?

In the words of John Ortberg, writing in "Faith and Doubt," "This is an amazing picture. They have seen him, listened to him, followed him, studied him, and seen him crucified and resurrected – and the last thing we read about them is 'and some doubted.' ... Then Jesus gives the disciples what is called the Great Commission. ... Jesus looks at these worshipping doubters and says: 'You go! You doubters, go. You risk your lives for me. ... And you will find as you go that it is your own doubts that are healed.' Disciples are not people who never doubt. They doubt and worship. They doubt and serve. They doubt and help each other with their doubts (pages 176, 177)."

God, it seems, has called each of us to a life of faith and trust, and there is no other way. Like it or not, this is the way that it is. God is an Eternal Spirit -- Majestic, Sovereign, Transcendent -- and He has chosen most generally not to communicate to us through our material, human frame of reference.


But, as Ortberg has pointed out, He has not left us without an intelligent, tangible, answer to our doubts, a solution that is provable to anyone with an open mind. His name is Jesus. I believe in God, in His benevolence, His care, and His ultimate triumph – because Jesus did. Sure, it demands faith, but I have chosen to put my trust in Him rather than trust my own understanding. The perspectives that have been proposed by other's who have suggested an approach that keeps God out of the picture don't square with reality in my world.

None of us is able to live without faith and trust – in something. The fundamental issues of life – our origin, our purpose, our morality, and our destiny – all demand our attention. We can, of course, "bury our heads in the sand" and simply refuse to think. If that, however, is not an option, then we either place ultimate trust in our feelings or we look for someone else to follow – and let them do our thinking for us.

When life has challenged my faith, when doubts overwhelm me with unanswered questions, I hold steady. To think of this as the only heaven I am ever going to know is simply not acceptable. I will not surrender to my instincts and exploit the physical to my own peril; neither will I accept a tomorrow that will not ultimately bring righteousness and justice. And even if I am totally wrong, my life is still testimony to the fact that ignorance with Jesus has led to a far better life than the wisdom to be found in anything society has to offer.

Faith and trust, they are a choice, and I have chosen to follow God. I am convinced that I won't be disappointed, and my proof can be summarized in one name: Jesus!

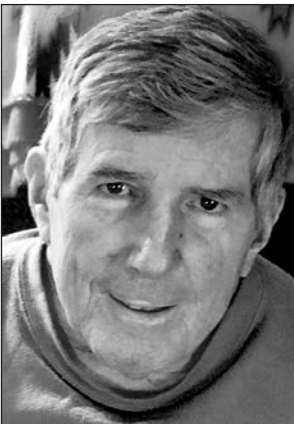
approved foster home ( & BTW: what a great way to get involved with our organization)!

## North Country Notebook

### A walk, in place of a run, offers many a reason to stop

On Monday morning--two days ago, on May 12--residents of far northern Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont awoke to a blanket of new snow, on the ground and atop picnic tables prematurely dragged out of winter storage by overly optimistic inhabitants of the frozen tundra.

Local historians said the last time it snowed this late was a century before, in the spring of Ought 8. "No, it was the spring of Aught 8," remonstrated Fenton Hardwick, of East B Hill, Maine. "You media people and the forecasters are always getting it wrong. It's supposed to mean Zero, so it's Aught 8, as in '08."

In that year, Mr. Hardwick recalled, the curled-up little feet of roosting chickens froze to their perches, and hapless hens could be released only by careful use of a hair dryer, courtesy of the R.E.A., rural electrification, which came to the countryside 30 years later. "Yep, that was the spring of '38,"

# Traffic shifts planned on I-93 in Tilton-Northfield area

**N O R T H F I E L D** — The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) announces traffic shifts will begin Monday, May 8 on I-93 in Northfield and Tilton to allow for the rehabilitation of two interstate bridges.

The project involves the rehabilitation of the “Red-Listed bridges” that carry I-93 northbound and southbound over the Win-

nipesaukee River, NH Railroad, and a recreation trail. To complete the work, the traffic diversion and shifts will be utilized. Motorists are advised to stay alert and drive with caution through this work zone.

Beck & Bellucci, Inc. of Franklin is the prime contractor of the \$8.5 million project, which has a completion date of June 2019.

More recently, he’s made six extended trips to the lake to record the festivals and daily lives of the Aymara and Quechua Indians living on the shores—and to connect with the spirit of his great-great-grandfather Carlos, a photographer and musician who lived by Lake Titicaca in the late nineteenth century. Emanuel will discuss his Lake Titicaca project and other work, including his coverage of the Co-

lombian civil war, which has earned him awards from the National Press Photographers Association and the World Press Photo Foundation.

### Give Mom a Gift to Help Her Financial Future

With Mother’s Day around the corner, you might wonder if you should go beyond chocolates and flowers this year and give Mom something that can help her far into the future. What sort of financial gift can improve her life? You could, for instance, encourage your mother to fund her IRA. As long as she has any earned income, she is eligible to invest in a traditional or Roth IRA (although a Roth IRA does have income limits which, if exceeded, will reduce and eventually eliminate contributions). In 2017, the IRA contribution limit is \$5,500, or \$6,500 for individuals 50 or older.

Traditional IRA contributions may be deductible, depending on one’s income, and earnings can grow tax deferred. Taxes are due upon withdrawal and withdrawals prior to age 59½ may be subject to a 10% IRS penalty. Roth IRA contributions are not deductible, but earnings are distributed tax-free, provided an investor has had the account at least five years and doesn’t start taking withdrawals until age 59½. You can’t contribute directly to your mother’s IRA, but you can give her money to use

for that purpose, if she chooses. And since she has until April 17, 2018, to fully fund her IRA for the 2017 tax year, your gift now may help make it that much easier for Mom to “max out” on her account.

Here’s another suggestion: Consider helping Mom pay one or two months’ worth of insurance premiums. It’s possible that your mother is paying for multiple insurance policies, like life insurance and disability or long-term care insurance, so any financial help on your part would be valuable. You might also want to give Mom some tips on how she can help maintain her financial independence throughout her life. If she ever needed some type of long-term care, such as an extended stay in a nursing home or the services of a home health aide, the costs could be extremely high, and Medicare typically pays little of these expenses. So you might want to connect her mother with a financial professional, who can provide strategies for protecting her from long-term care costs. Here’s one more suggestion: Give a gift to a charitable

organization your mother supports. Even though you’re making the gift in Mom’s name, you should be able to reap some benefits yourself, even apart from the good feelings you’ll get by helping a charitable group. As long as the charity has 501(c)(3) status (named after the section of the Internal Revenue Code that governs such groups), your gift can offer you tax advantages. On the most basic level, a gift of cash can earn you a tax deduction.

So, for example, if you are in the 25% tax bracket, and you give \$1,000 to a qualified charity, you will be able to deduct \$250 from your taxes. You may be able to get even more tax benefits if you donate appreciated assets, such as stocks, to a charity. If you give appreciated stocks you’ve held for more than one year, you can deduct the value of the securities, based on their worth when you make the gift – and neither you nor the charity will have to pay capital gains taxes on the donated investments.

Your mother has done a lot for you. This Mother’s Day, show her you appreciate her efforts.

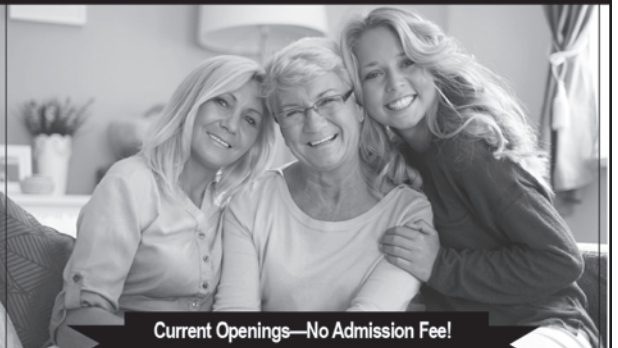

that a black 2006 Pontiac Grand Prix driven by 33-year-old Brian Gage of Pittsfield was traveling northbound on Route 3 while a blue 2008 Chevy Trailblazer, operated by 55-year-old Dennis Bourey of Sanbornton, was headed south with at least one passenger on board.

"For unknown reasons at this time, the black 2006 Grand Prix crossed over the solid double yellow line and into the path of the blue

2008 Chevy Trailblazer," New Hampshire State Police Sgt. Steven Wheeler said in a press release issued Monday afternoon.

He reported that Gage, however, was later charged with aggravated Driving While Intoxicated.

As a result of the collision, the victims sustained serious, life threatening injuries. They were each transported by ambulance to Lakes Region General Hospital, and Gage was subsequently transported by helicopter to

Maine Medical Center in Portland, Maine.

Bourey was treated at LRGH for his injuries, while his passenger, 50-year-old Patricia Bourey, was then med-flighted to Massachusetts General Hospital, where she, too, was treated for life-threatening injuries. Further information on their condition was not available as of our press deadline for this week's edition.

The accident remains under investigation by the State Police Collision Analysis and Recon-

struction Unit (C.A.R.), with assistance from Tilton Police, Wheeler said. They ask that with anyone with information on the crash contact Trooper First Class Michael J. Pelletier by phone at 223-8699, or by email at michael.pelletier@dos.nh.gov.

Also taking part in the response and rescue operations were police officers from Tilton, along with local fire and EMT units from Tilton-Northfield who received assistance from several surrounding towns.
