Stormy weather fails to dampen community spirit at Belmont's Old Home Day celebration

BELMONT — Although Mother Nature intervened with some much-needed rain on Saturday evening, postponing fireworks and other

nighttime events for Belmont Old Home Day, the daytime festivities went off without a hitch as everyone gathered in the village for races, live music, a parade and lots of food and fun.

The first reference to an Old Home Day celebration in Belmont was made in the 1903 town report, making this the 113th anniversary of the annual event. The theme this year was "Bridging

Our Generations," as old and young came together to celebrate the community and all it has to offer.

After a morning filled with road racing, pancakes, children's games

and live music from the band King Chrome, the focus shifted from the town green to Main Street when the annual parade got underway at 1 p.m.

Grand Marshals Theresa and Nelson Rolfe led the way, riding in a comfortable convertible and waving to their fellow residents.

Parade Emcee Tom Murphy said the couple have been residents of Belmont for many years, raising their children and grandchildren in the town as well.

"They've been keeping this community alive for generations. Thank you," Murphy called out as they drove by.

Ruth Mooney and Jon Pike also greeted townsfolk from their convertible, as did Miss Lakes Region 2017 Elizabeth Henry, Miss Lakes Region Outstanding Teen Sophia Joyal and Lakes Region Princesses Abi and Ali who followed not far behind.

The 2016 Belmont Good Citizen Corey Yelle also took part, along with Girl Scout Troop 21532 and local Boy Scout Troop 65.

Belmont High School's marching band added lively entertainment to the parade. Joining them in the day were New Hampshire's old-

bean folk song popularized in the 1950's by Harry Belafonte.


While the music filled the fairgrounds on Mile Hill Road in Belmont, all sorts of farm animals filled the

barns. Goats, sheep, pigs, rabbits, cattle, chickens, ducks and more were all judged on their care and appearance, while other animals were busy demonstrating skills

Selectmen roll up their sleeves to clean up Tilton's Island Park

TILTON — Despite soaring temperatures last weekend, Tilton selectmen Jon Scanlon and Joe Jesseman rolled up their sleeves and went to work around Island Park, clearing brush and some smaller trees that have come to block the view of the beautiful island that sits in the Winnipesaukee River between Tilton and Northfield.

"It's such a beautiful spot, right at the gateway to downtown Tilton, but people driving through couldn't even see it anymore. It doesn't take long for trees and brush to grow up in the way so I just wanted to

fix that," said Scanlon.

While town crews from the two communities share responsibility for the maintenance of Island Park, summer months also find them extremely busy with road projects. Thus, Scanlon brought his chain saw down to the park and did the work for them.

As he walked along the riverbank cutting down the overgrowth, Jesseman was "the muscle man," Scanlon said, pulling it all up from the river and stacking it neatly for the town crews to pick up during the week.

Scanlon said he and his fellow selectmen believe in leading by ex-





NORTH COUNTRY NOTEBOOK

*Any rain that falls
just now will be
staying right at home*

"When the water's low, the rocks stand out like hay bales," Corey Roman liked to say when he was steering his boat around invisible boulders in the fast and furious Menihik Rapids, in central Labrador. For 13 years a bunch of us from northern New Hampshire and Vermont went up to fish at Menihik, around a thousand miles north of my home in Jefferson.

I was reminded of this when I took the slower way home from Lebanon a week or so ago, and along the Wild Ammonoosuc between Lisbon and Littleton saw rocks sticking up like hay bales.


The water is low in

the Ammonoosuc and all other free-flowing rivers, evidence of a long spate of dry weather that gardeners know about all too well. In my case, this is only the second time I've had to water my garden in all the years I've had one, and as I approach 70, that's saying something.

Most of the time, along the northern tier of New England, the ground is pretty well saturated and the water tables, either perched or under valley floors, are pretty well full, evinced by the thousands of springs and seeps created by rainwater that follows layers of clay and fine silt to emerge on the sides of ridges and hills.

Not for nothing are the vast expanses of woodlands here wryly referred to as "The Asbestos Forest," because under normal conditions it would be pretty difficult to get a good forest fire going. I used to kid Jack Sargent, long-time chief of the state Forest Fire Service, about always seeming to have a convenient forest fire of 20 acres or so to battle just before budget



Questioning new nuclear weaponry spending

To the Editor:

On a recent Diane Rehm Show (NPR / NHPR), a guest recounted that when he was a young white Southerner, he thought it was his due to be served his ice cream cone before a black customer ahead of him in line, that customer also a child. The lament was – we lead our children to follow our practices, no questions asked. Not until the guest was a college student in the North did he review his attitudes and see his racism.

Following up – we are akin to unquestioningly obedient children to believe that military choices are good and deserve funding. Period.

The current Catalyst, magazine of Union of Concerned Scientists, points out that under Pres. George W. Bush a homeland missile defense system costing billions of dollars was put into "rush" mode and exempted from the usual oversight procedures. "Shielded from Oversight" by Elliott Negin can be read online. In 17 tests of this Ground-Based-Midcourse-Defense system, nine have failed. Of "nine intercept tests, only three succeeded in destroying their targets."

In the same issue, Laura Gregg, "rocket sci-

tist," judges that the GMD described above "could prompt decision makers to act more aggressively than they might otherwise, which could actually increase the risk of an adversary launching nuclear missiles at the United States." Long ago, 1983, the TV movie, "The Day After," caught the public's attention that we are always risking nuclear war, armed as we are with missiles – and ours that target other missiles also condemn us to being targeted.

Between the U.S. and Russia we have 14,000 nuclear warheads. One thousand of them used would make our planet uninhabitable. Folks, this is about the end of culture, families, nature, everything. Time to tell our decision-makers (and presidential / congressional candidates) to take our missiles off hair-trigger alert, and time to question a new trillion-dollar nuclear buildup. Oversight needed with that destabilizing GMD? Appropriate questioning and common sense needed altogether!

Hermit Woods Winery asks customers to help support a living wage for its employees

MEREDITH — There has been a lot of talk during this election year, both in New Hampshire and across the country, about whether the minimum wage should be raised. At Hermit Woods Winery, they have stopped talking about it and decided to take action.

On Aug. 19, Hermit Woods will raise the hourly pay rate of all their employees to \$15 an hour. They will achieve this by charging their customers a 'living wage surcharge' of 3.5 percent on all sales and applying the money raised towards salaries.

Owners Bob Manley, Ken Hardcastle, and Chuck Lawrence explain that they understand all too well how hard it can be to get by on low wages as they have put almost everything they have earned back into their growing company over the past six years.

"We have built a hard working dedicated team. We want to be able to reward them with a living wage so they can support their families and pursue their passions in life as we have," says Manley. "Some of our employees are in school or just out of school and have college debt to pay off, while others have families to support, two of whom are single moms. If they're going to work hard to help us grow our business, we want to make sure they have the resources to afford to live."

New Hampshire can be an expensive place to live, with the cost of living about 16 percent higher than the rest of the country. Prior to this plan, Hermit Woods was making their best effort to pay all their employees \$12 per hour (a rate that is still higher than

the average for similar positions). Based on the research they had done and the cost of living in the Lakes Region, the owners of Hermit Woods Winery felt that simply wasn't enough.

Manley explains, "We are not sure \$15 is enough, but it is a heck of a lot closer than \$12."

The owners of Hermit Woods Winery feel strongly about their decision and sincerely hope that their customers will support and embrace it. Unlike many wineries and other similar service industries, Hermit Woods does not encourage tipping.

"We feel the sur-

charge is a better way to ensure everyone is rewarded equally for their hard work" says Manley. "We want to ensure our customers that every penny raised via this surcharge will go towards increasing our employees pay and nothing else."

Manley, Hardcastle, and Lawrence would like to be able to say they were the first to think of this concept, but they are not. Manley recently read a story that was published via NH Business Review about a small restaurant in Vermont, Popolo's, that began a




Raymond Burr and Angela Lansbury star in "Please Murder Me!" on LRPA this weekend

LACONIA—Join Lakes Region Public Access Television at 10:30 p.m. this Friday and Saturday night (Aug 19 & 20) for our "LRPA After Dark" presentation of 1956's crime drama "Please Murder Me!" starring Angela Lansbury and Raymond Burr.

Told in flashback, "Please Murder Me!" is the story of a deadly love triangle involving attorney Craig Carlson (Burr), who's fallen hard for Myra Leeds (Lansbury), the wife of Joe (played by character actor Dick Foran),

Craig's close friend and WWII buddy. Craig owes Joe his life and so is tormented by his feelings for Myra. Joe tells Craig in confidence that he suspects Myra of having an affair. It's too much for Craig to bear, so he confesses to Joe that he's "the other man." Surprisingly, Joe isn't angry—he asks Craig for a few days to think things over. Craig is mystified by Joe's behavior. When he asks Myra about it, she advises him to do nothing until Joe responds. A few nights later, Myrna shoots Joe, claiming self-defense. Craig, while

shocked by his friend's alleged behavior, agrees to serve as Myra's attorney. He defends her superbly, even putting his own reputation on the line, anticipating a happy and peaceful life after the conclusion of the trial. But there is more, it seems, to Myra than meets the eye.

"Please Murder Me!" is one of the least-known entries in the film noir genre. While it certainly is a small, low budget thriller, it is a thriller nonetheless, and features some wonderful plot twists wrapped up in a bracing 78-minute

film. Angela Lansbury is terrific here, playing, as she often did early in her career, the heartless femme fatale. Classic television fans will likely recognize minor character actors including Dick Foran as the cuckolded husband and Denver Pyle (best known for shows such as "The Dukes of Hazzard" and "The Doris Day Show") as a police lieutenant. But the standout is Raymond Burr, who ironically, up until that point in his career, usually played the bad guy (who can forget him as the ruthless killer in Hitchcock's "Rear Window"?). Burr's intelligent and earnest lawyer, who is more than slightly unhinged by the film's end, was likely the model for his biggest, career-defining role—that of TV lawyer Perry Mason. "Please Murder Me!" deserves to be better known by film fans everywhere. So grab your popcorn and meet us after dark for this sel-

dom-seen thriller from the past.



As fall season approaches, five story lines to watch

REGION — Believe it or not, the fall sports season is officially under way, with preseason practices beginning this week for the varsity squads at Belmont High School and Winnisquam Regional High School. Clean slates and fresh starts are the name of the game, with every squad eyeing the potential for a state championship and/or marked improvement from a year ago.

There will be a lot to talk about throughout what will be a very busy fall season, and questions will provide answers in due time. But for now, what's the fun of preseason without querying about the months ahead? Here's a look at some of the questions we'll be exploring over the course of a highly-anticipated fall on the horizon.

How does Winnisquam football respond after losses of Serrano and Harmon?

It's certainly going to look strange on the

gridiron this season in Tilton. The Bears plunge ahead without the services of longtime contributors and All-State performers in quarterback Christian Serrano and wide receiver Tim Harmon. Simply put, the duo gave Winnisquam a chance to win every time it stepped onto the field.

But with graduation comes a fresh start, and chances for young up-and-comers to make their mark. Is there the next Serrano entering the program? Who will take it upon themselves to step up and fill some of those voids? The opening game is set for Sept. 2 on the road at Somersworth (7 p.m.).

What can Alice Riley do for an encore?

As a freshman last fall, the Belmont cross country star burst onto the scene with a dazzling rookie appearance at the NHIAA Division III state championship. The precocious harrier took fourth overall in the state, setting the bar extremely high for what is expected to be an out-

standing (and likely record-breaking) career as a Red Raider.

After another great season outdoors on the track, what does Riley have in store for a follow-up sophomore campaign?

What will new coaches bring to the Belmont equation?

The Red Raiders welcome two new varsity coaches on the volleyball (John Rogers) and girls' soccer (Cevat Vural) scene this fall. Both

squads are loaded with returning talent ready to take the next step, and should prove to be difficult outs come tournament time. What kind of immediate impact will those coaches have on their programs?

What to expect from Winnisquam volleyball?

The perennial powers lost some huge pieces from last year's NHIAA

Division III state runner-up squad, including top hitters Marissa DeBlasie and Lindsay Raymond. It'll be a much different-looking Bear roster, though the good news is that sophomore setter Talia DeBlasie is back after an outstanding rookie season as the team's starter in that key position.

The good news is that veteran coach Mike Liveno always has a plan,

and with DeBlasie setting the tone, the Bears have the foundation for another solid season.

Will Belmont soccer turn the corner?

It was admittedly a disappointing end to last season for the Belmont boys' soccer team. The Red Raiders had state championship aspirations, and when the D-III soccer bracket opened up after some big upsets, all signs pointed to a potential deep run. But Belmont was edged in the quarterfinals, one win shy of its first Final Four appearance since 2012.

While the graduation losses will hurt (i.e. TJ Hennessey, Kyle Gelinas), this year's senior class is absolutely loaded with talent and experience, as in three and four year varsity experience. With returning starters up and down the field, there is every reason why Belmont should once again be in title contention come the month of November.
