

## Officials push for improved safety on Route 49

REGION — Following the latest fatal wreck on Route 49 last month, residents and officials are calling for additional changes to improve safety on the road.

A head-on collision on July 23 resulted in the deaths of Joseph Nardone, 61, of Leicester, and Rene Lavallee, 48, of Spencer. Nardone, headed south on Route 49 in his Chevy Impala, was attempting to pass another southbound vehicle near the Spencer town line when he struck Lavallee's northbound Dodge sedan. Witnesses told police that Nardone had passed another southbound vehicle shortly before the collision.

Several other recent accidents on Route 49 were also

caused by drivers attempting to pass using the oncoming traffic lane. Stretching from Sturbridge to Spencer, the road has seen multiple fatal wrecks in recent years. With about four miles of the road running through East Brookfield, police there have noticed an overall increase in speed and reckless driving over the last few years. Police in East Brookfield, Spencer, and Sturbridge will continue to beef up patrols in an effort to get drivers to slow down.

"All three towns and the state do our fair share of enforcement on Route 49. That said, everyone seems to be in a hurry these days," said Spencer Police Chief David Darrin. "Route 49 is straight mostly, with a good line of sight. There is really only one reason for these crash-

es — careless drivers."

Lane reconfigurations were recently made to Route 49 at the Podunk Road intersection, with a turn lane added to increase safety. But many residents are calling for additional changes to slow drivers down and prevent dangerous passing. Ideas for improvements include the installation of a barrier in the center of the road and the addition of flashing yellow signals at high-danger intersections.

Before any improvements could be made, a study would need to be completed by MassDOT.

"I expect further changes to the road will be necessary to make the road as safe as possible, but people have to do their part as well," said Senator

## LeBoeuf seeks financial support for Leicester's water woes

LEICESTER — State Rep. David LeBoeuf recently helped secure financial support to assist with challenges related to water and sewer infrastructure.

Leicester's water woes have been well-documented in recent months. In March, residents in the Cherry Valley Rochdale Water District faced the highest water rates in the state, paying \$145.20 per 1,000 cubic feet of water supplied by Worcester. Five months later, officials believe the passage of recent legislation can offer hope for eventual relief.

Last month, the Massachusetts House of Representatives voted 158-10 to pass legislation investing billions to help cities and towns across Massachusetts fund infrastructure projects aimed at addressing climate change

and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Working with members of leadership on the House floor, Rep. LeBoeuf (D-Worcester) helped include language in the bill that provides assistance to communities facing challenges related to water and sewer infrastructure. The final version of the bill passed by the House enables water and sewer districts to apply for grant funding to improve their infrastructure.

"Every time I review a piece of legislation, I aim to elevate the concerns of my constituents to the forefront," LeBoeuf said. "I started meeting with House leadership about the water and sewer challenges facing residents in Leicester, Cherry Valley, and Rochdale before I was sworn into office. Not a day goes by that I do not work on this issue."

# Charlton, Spencer officials work to improve water infrastructure

REGION — Officials in Charlton and Spencer continue to take steps toward improving water infrastructure and preparing for potential natural risks.

Several assessment projects were made possible by the towns' participation in the Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness program (MVP), a statewide grant-funded program that helps communities build resilience to climate change. The funds help towns begin the process of planning projects in several strategic areas.

Charlton and Spencer officials have focused their MVP

planning efforts on multiple aspects of water infrastructure improvement, including drinking water and wastewater facilities; stormwater infrastructure; road-stream crossings; and local dams. The overall goal is to enhance the towns' preparedness through cost-effective measures.

Several other area communities have also taken advantage of the MVP program and similar grant-based opportunities. With experts predicting an increase in significant local flooding events over the next decade, towns need to be prepared for the intensity of these storms, officials said. To that end, leaders in both Charlton and Spencer will finalize an integrated water infrastruc-

ture vulnerability assessment and climate resiliency plan. These studies determine the overall vulnerability of water infrastructure components in each town, as well as critical projects needed to improve resilience.

"This important partnership with Charlton, funded through grants made available by the Commonwealth, will help to strengthen the capacity of both towns to respond to extreme precipitation events and flooding," said Spencer Town Administrator Thomas Gregory.

The assessments in each town also include evaluations of culverts, bridges, and dams. Several dams and road-stream crossings have already

been reviewed in both towns. Moreover, conceptual designs will be created to support future projects.

Communities statewide which complete the initial phases of the MVP program are eligible to receive additional grant funding. Future projects can involve everything from public education to nature-based storm damage protection. Green infrastructure projects are also a constant focus for state and local officials.

"Improving water-related infrastructure is critical to both communities," Gregory added. "I look forward to future opportunities to continue this work around community resilience."

In Spencer and Charlton, a

combined 22 sites have already been proposed for green infrastructure retrofits. Another ten green infrastructure concepts were developed as part of the assessment, officials said. A green roof retrofit was also proposed for Charlton Middle School.

Finally, site specific adaptation recommendations have been made for 13 water infrastructure sites. Future projects will be reviewed as funding allows.

With assistance from the Central Massachusetts Regional Planning Commission, Charlton officials also recently completed a draft hazard mitigation plan. This document features several potential future projects.

# Gobi and Peake announce funding for regional transit authorities

BOSTON — Sen. Anne M. Gobi (D-Spencer) and Rep. Sarah Peake (D-Provincetown), co-chairs of the legislature's Regional Transit Authority Caucus, were pleased to announce today that funding for Regional Transit Authorities have been included in the final version of the FY20 State Budget at a rate of \$90,500,000 – an \$2.5 Million increase over the funds allocated this past fiscal year.

"Everyone who works at the RTA's and the Advisory Boards have worked to reduce costs and increase ridership," remarked Sen. Gobi. "This is in step towards a much needed increase in funding, and I am committed to contin-

ue to work with them to bring regional equity and best practices to benefit the riders outside the MBTA system."

When asked for comment, Representative Peake had this to say: "This critical RTA funding provides important transportation services to citizens living outside the Metro-Boston area, improving the quality of life our seniors, students, and everyone in between. I will continue to work with Senator Gobi and the various RTAs across the Commonwealth to ensure that best practices are being met and services are being enhanced while saving money where we can."

Regional Transit Authorities

(RTAs) provide public transportation to communities outside of the Metro-Boston area and are a vital part of the Massachusetts economy, contributing to fuel tourism and economic development. Our most vulnerable citizens, including seniors, rely on public transit to get to and from their place of employment, medical appointments and more.

Over 32 million riders throughout the commonwealth depend on the state's 15 Regional Transit Authorities (RTAs), but increased costs of service and insufficient state funding has stressed RTA budgets. RTAs have not received an increase in state funding in over three years, all while costs continue to rise to

maintain service. In order to maintain current ridership demands, operating costs, and to prevent severe budget deficits of our state's RTAs, Senator Gobi, Representative Peake and the rest of the RTA Caucus advocated for the increase in RTA funding to ensure that all communities in the state have adequate public transportation free from service cuts or reductions.



Paxton St.). The project represents a joint effort between the Commission, which is an active part of Leicester's town government, and the Society, a private organization in town. Together, the two entities established the Friends of Swan Tavern to raise funds for the maintenance of the building and the museum.

The effort began back in January, when members of the Historical Commission sought permission from selectmen to administer the town-owned Swan Tavern and create the local historical museum. The Board was amenable to the request as long as there would be no costs incurred by the town.

As a formal board in town, the Leicester Historical Commission is forbidden from soliciting funds. However, the Historical Society is allowed to seek funds as a private entity. As a result, the Friends of Swan Tavern was created to include members of the Commission and the Society,

as well as community members. The Friends group now includes more than 50 followers on Facebook, a standing membership of more than 20 members, and a five-member board of directors.

For project leaders, it was a thrill to get permission to transform a classic building in town into a museum that all residents can enjoy.

"Leicester has a rich history, and to date there has never truly been a central location to celebrate Leicester's past," said Jason Grimshaw, a member of the project leadership team. "Both the Leicester Historical Commission and the Leicester Historical Society, along with several private collectors, have numerous artifacts that deserve to see the light of day."

The Leicester Public Library housed historical artifacts for a number of years, but over time many items were lost from that collection. Other items had to be kept in storage in residents' houses because there was no dedicated space in town for an extensive collection. But with the launch of the Swan Tavern Project, residents are excited

to have a place to celebrate the town's past.

The Historical Society received a \$5,000 grant to assist with the project, and members hope to receive ongoing grant funds to defray the costs of maintenance and operating the building year-round. Moreover, the Friends group established a board of directors tasked with approving all expenditures related to the museum.

"This represents what can happen when people get creative and work together," Grimshaw told the New Leader. "The Swan Tavern Leicester Historical Museum is a collaborative effort between the town, the Historical Commission, the Historical Society, and the newly created Friends of Swan Tavern group. No single one of these organizations or entities could succeed with this project alone."

Significant progress has been made on the project, and the goal is to have the Swan Tavern open to the public by mid-September. Project leaders hope to

have the grand opening coincide with the town's annual Harvest Fair on the nearby Town Common.

A long-term goal for project leaders is to host several events at Swan Tavern, including such programs as wine tastings, themed events, and other small gatherings. All events and maintenance of the building will come at no cost to the town, as funding is provided by private donations, grants, and fundraising events.

For the last two years, the Swan Tavern has been occupied by Leicester Public Library while its staff awaited the completion of a renovation and expansion to its main building. Now that the Swan Tavern is on its way toward the next chapter of its rich history, several volunteers have gotten involved to ready the museum.

Project leaders thank student volunteers from Leicester

Anne Gobi, of Spencer. "Speed is a big factor, and couple that with being distracted, it leads to disaster."

Added State Rep. Peter Durant, who also lives in Spencer, "I think we need to request that DOT relook at the road as a whole to see what we can do to improve safety."

With several long straightaways on Route 49, many drivers use the oncoming traffic lane to pass multiple vehicles. A few residents told the New Leader they have nearly been struck by wrong-way drivers on the road. Many motorists using Route 49 are heading to and from the Massachusetts Turnpike, and police have often seen them continue at highway speed on the two-lane road.

"People need to slow down, wear their seatbelts, and put down their devices," said East Brookfield Police Lt. William Gregoire. "Please do not try to pass multiple vehicles. It's just not safe."

A large stretch of Route 20 in Brimfield was recently reconfigured after a series of fatal accidents. The total number of lanes in that stretch was reduced from four to two, and several turn lanes were added at busy intersections. Other sections of the heavily traveled Route 20 feature barriers to prevent passing.

Legislators and local officers agree that regardless of potential changes made to Route 49, the ultimate responsibility for safety lies with motorists. Speeding, passing violations, distracted driving, and seatbelt use continue to be enforcement objectives for police.

The bill will now go to the state Senate. Looking ahead, LeBoeuf hopes to continue his momentum in support of residents in Leicester and Worcester.

"After all the time spent working on this issue, I am proud to see a good step in the right direction. And as a first-term representative, I am proud to have gotten that language included," LeBoeuf added. "Our voices in Worcester and Leicester matter. Our voices can be heard, and I will continue to fight to improve our quality of life."

Rep. LeBoeuf has also supported additional ways to provide relief to residents who are facing financial burdens related to the costs of water and sewer services. Through the 10-year GreenWorks grant program supported by LeBoeuf and other legislators, \$1 billion will go toward funding clean energy, energy efficiency, and climate change resiliency measures. These programs are intended to cut emissions, fortify infrastructure, and reduce municipal costs. The legislation also invests \$325 million in other municipal green projects.

Modeled after the

state's MassWorks program, GreenWorks funds projects that improve climate preparedness and resiliency, build energy storage facilities, or implement measures included in statewide climate adaptation strategies. Projects also focus on mitigating the impacts of climate change by reducing carbon emissions.

The Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs will accept applications annually and administer the GreenWorks program, which is funded through the issuance of bonds.





Come up with weekly, monthly and yearly goals for the school year.

Laying out clothes and packing bags the night before will leave more time for a healthy break-fast in the morning. Creating a place for notes home or permission slips is a great way to not let important things slip.

Planning a healthy lunch goes without saying, however sending your child off to school with a refillable water bottle will help keep them hydrated throughout the day.

These are just a few helpful tips to kick off the school year on the right foot.

It might not be on your calendar, but Aug. 14 is Social Security Day. Since it was enacted on Aug. 14, 1935, Social

Security has provided some financial support for millions of Americans during their retirement years. While Social Security benefits, by themselves, probably aren't enough to enable you to retire comfortably, they can be a key part of your overall retirement income strategy — if you use them wisely.

To help you make decisions about Social Security, you will need to answer these questions:

When should I start taking my benefits? You can take Social Security once you reach 62, but if you wait until your full retirement age, which will probably be between 66 and 67, you'll get much bigger monthly checks, and if you wait until 70, you'll get the biggest possible payments. Before deciding when to begin receiving your benefits, you'll need to weigh a few factors, including your estimated longevity and your other sources of income.

How should I consider potential spousal benefits? If you are married, or if you're divorced but were married for at least 10 years, you could receive up to half of your spouse's full retirement benefit (offset by your own benefit, and reduced if you claim early). If you outlive your spouse, you could claim survivor benefits, which can provide either your own benefits or 100 percent of your deceased spouse's, whichever is larger. Consequently, the higher-earning spouse might want to postpone taking benefits for as long as possible to maximize the survivor benefit.

How much can I earn without reducing my Social Security benefits? If you are younger than your full retirement age and you are receiving Social Security, the Social Security Administration will withhold \$1 from your benefits for each \$2 you earn over a certain threshold (which, in 2019, is \$17,640). For the year you reach your full retirement age, your benefits could be withheld by \$1 for every \$3 you earn over \$46,920. But once you reach your full retirement age, you can earn as much as you want without your benefits being withheld, although your benefits could still be taxed, depending on your income.

How much of my pre-retirement income will Social Security replace? Generally speaking, you should expect Social Security to replace slightly more than a third of your pre-retirement income. However, the higher your income during your working years, the lower the replacement value of Social Security will be.

What other sources of retirement income should I develop? Contribute as much as you can afford to your IRA and your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan. You may want to consult with a financial professional, who can look at your entire retirement income picture and recommend moves to help you achieve the lifestyle you've envisioned for your later years.

Keep in mind that your decisions about Social Security filing strategies should always be based on your specific needs and health considerations. For more information, visit the Social Security Administration website at [socialsecurity.gov](http://socialsecurity.gov).

One final word: You may have concerns about the stability of Social Security. While no one can predict the future, many potential solutions exist to put the program on more solid footing. Consequently, try to focus on the actions you can control.

# A Mixed Bag of Tips

Every once in a while enough have accumulated to make up a column. With this in mind the following "mixed bag" of tips are offered. Whipping up a rich dessert and you're out of heavy cream? Save yourself a trip to the store. Light cream will whip up perfectly with the addition of an egg white or two.

**Lime Mint Iced Tea:**  
To do: Mix four (regular Lipton type) tea bags, one quarter cup sugar and about a cup and a half of fresh mint leaves in a quart of boiling water. Allow to steep for 15 minutes. Strain out tea bags and leaves. Chill and add a quarter cup of lime juice. Serves 4.

**Dust Bunnies** run for their lives when you make your own dusting oil that rivals commercial brands. Just mix three parts light mineral oil with one part corn oil. Then add a drop of lemon or clove oil for a pleasant scent. Put this on your dust mop or dust rag and store in a plastic bag. When the mop or rag becomes dirty, simply wash in warm water and reapply.

Did you ever notice the underside of a doormat always collects dirt? To make clean-up easier, fold a few newspapers to form a pad and place it under the mat to catch the dirt.

**DIY tip:** One of the secrets to getting a strong glue joint is to spread the glue evenly before joining surfaces. Application sticks don't always do the trick,

# Summer Basketball League title goes to Leicester, thanks to inspired defensive play

AUBURN — Lexi Dufries scored a game-high 14 points and Jenna Soden added 12 for the Leicester girls' basketball team, which used a big second half to expand upon a one-point halftime lead and run past Worcester Union, 39-28, in the championship game of the Auburn Summer Basketball League, played Tuesday, July 30, at Auburn High's Pappas Gymnasium.

With the win Leicester, the top-seeded team, finished 11-1. Worcester Union, the No. 3 seed, finished 9-4. Worcester Union advanced to the final by defeating fifth-seeded Quabbin, 22-16, in a semifinal-round game. Leicester made its way to the championship game by defeating seventh-seeded David Prouty, 37-30, in the semifinals.

Quabbin finished the summer season with an 8-4 mark while David Prouty ended up with a 5-8 record.

Leicester, which led, 16-15, at intermission, scored the first 13 points of the second half to

take command of the game, 29-15, with 12 minutes remaining. Dufries, who scored 12 of her points in the second half, had eight points in the run.

"I just let the offense come to me. My coach always tells me to just keep shooting so I just kept shooting and in the second half I started to hit," explained Dufries, a rising junior at Leicester High. "I feel like I was more open in the second half because my teammates did a great job of setting picks for me, picks which helped me to get open."

The word defense is sometimes seen as a "bad" word in summer league basketball — and often not played with the intensity as offense. Dufries, however, believed it played a big role in her team's victory.

"Our defense definitely contributed to the win, especially in the second half," Dufries said. "We played with more defensive intensity in the second half and we got some steals and rebounds and some fast-break baskets, and that opened things up for me and I was able to hit some shots."

Leicester coach Steve

Johnson agreed with his star guard regarding the notion that his team's second-half defense was instrumental in the victory.

"We're a very athletic team. We like to get after it defensively and when we get after it defensively it leads to the offensive end. I think we did a good job of that in the second half," Johnson said. "Lexi is a great shooter and she warmed up a little bit in the second half. At the same time our big guys [Soden, Jahmaire Pye and Abi Johnson, Steve's daughter] took over the game in the second half underneath. I think a combination of the two made the difference in the second half."

Coach Johnson said going into the summer league season, as well as the final, he placed a premium on his team playing good, strong defense.

"These girls don't just play basketball. A lot of them play soccer and softball and run track and they're all great athletes. Because they are so talented, one thing I know we can always do is play defense," he said. "I've coached these girls for a lot of years. They're the greatest girls in the world; they're the nicest kids. They do what they're told. They listen very well and they love to play defense."

Leicester's halftime lead was forged in large part by the play of Soden, who scored eight of her points in the first half. Soden's first-half points came on two runners in the lane, a put-back basket and a spin move in the post.

Also scoring for Leicester in the championship game were Erin Gerber (four points), Johnson (three points), Morgan Merrell, Sarah O'Connor and Hannah Dufries — Lexi's twin sister — all with two points each.

Lexi Dufries believes Leicester's summer league win will translate to more success for the high school team once the season begins in December.

"All these girls I'm playing with will be my teammates next season, so playing these games in the summer league is like having summer practices," Lexi Dufries said. "Playing together in the summer gives us a chance to learn how each other play. In the process I think it helps with our team chemistry and help us become a more consistent team."

# Grandmaison's drive powers Bartlett past Grafton for Summer League Championship

AUBURN — Dylan Grandmaison scored a game-high 24 points and Logan Paranto added 19 as Bartlett overcame an early first half deficit and defeated Grafton, 83-74, in the championship game of the Auburn Boys' Basketball Summer League, played on Monday, July 29, at Auburn High's Pappas Gymnasium.

Top-seeded Bartlett advanced to the final by outlasting Millbury (6-7), the No. 8 seed, 48-42 in the semifinal round, also played on July 29. Grafton, the No. 3 seed, made its way into the championship game by routing fifth-seeded Uxbridge (9-4), 81-39, in the semis.

The first half of the final was a back-and-forth affair with Bartlett trailing on a few occasions, twice by three points.

Bartlett led, 23-22, with four minutes remaining in the first half, when it embarked on a game-deciding 15-3 run — including 10 straight points to start the spurt — to take a 38-25 lead with 1:20 left in the first half.

Grandmaison started the run with an old-fashioned three-point play as he was fouled driving to the hoop with 3:50 left in the half and then converted the free throw, and he finished the run with a pair of free throws. Also scoring in the spurt were Wilson Aybar and Colin Minarik, who had five points each as well.

Throughout the run, and even prior to it, Grandmaison seemed to energize his teammates by pushing the pace of the offense and attacking the basket.

"I noticed at one point in the first half when we were

down that my team was fading a little, so I decided to push the pace, work my hardest and attack the basket," said Grandmaison, who thought the grind of the Indians' semifinal-round game with Millbury left them tired. "I did not play well [against Millbury] so I knew I had to step up my game because Grafton's a good team.

"I knew I had to come into this game with a lot of energy, and actually, after struggling early, the whole team had a lot of energy. I think we used that energy to win the game," explained Grandmaison, who acknowledged that he is bigger, stronger and faster than he was when the high school season ended. "I feel like I've evolved as a player. I was not good going into high school. But now, after working hard on my game for the last two years, I have the confidence to know I can go out there and make a difference for my team."

Todd Minarik, Bartlett's summer league coach, was not surprised that Grandmaison jump-started the Bartlett effort in the first half.

"Dylan is definitely the guy who provides energy for us on the floor. He gives us everything he's got every time out. He's got a high motor, which is what we're looking for," Todd Minarik said. "He really picked it up against Grafton in the first half. That was definitely when we made our move. When he gets it going down low and has his inside-out game going, he's a hard person to stop."

Bartlett pushed its lead to as many as 20 points in the second half — 61-41 with 12:02 to play — but Grafton, thanks to five (of its 11) 3-pointers in the final 10 minutes, cut into its deficit, paring the Bartlett lead to eight points twice in the final minute of the game.

Aybar, who finished with 15 points, took over the game at that point, hitting eight straight free throws to keep Grafton at an arm's length of the lead. Sean Stockhaus (four points) also hit a pair of free throws in the final minute.

"I was pleased with the way we dug in defensively in the second half," Todd Minarik said. "We can shoot and we know we're an offensive team, but at that point of the game it was about defense and the guys stepped up and made some stops. It was a great team effort."

Paranto's points were evenly divided between the first and second half. He scored 10 points in the first half — and hit a pair of 3-pointers — and nine points, and one 3, in the second half.

Bartlett finished off a perfect 13-0 summer season, while Grafton wound up 11-3.

## Auburn nearly pulls off upset of Lunenburg in CNEBA semifinals

AUBURN — Sure, the Auburn Rockets may have lost their best-of-three series to the Lunenburg Phillies, 2-1, in the Central New England Baseball Association (CNEBA) playoffs, but what the local nine showed tells a bigger story.

Auburn finished the regular season at 7-18 and was the final seed in the bracket. Lunenburg endured a 20-5-1 year, earned the top seed and hadn't lost a game since July 1. When the Rockets defeated the No. 4 Shrewsbury Dirt Dogs, 2-0, in the prior series, it set up the matchup with the Phillies in the league semifinals.

Lunenburg won Game 1, 1-0, on a walk-off squeeze bunt in the bottom of the seventh inning at Marshall Park on Tuesday, July 30. Auburn returned the favor the following evening at Auburn High,

taking a 4-2 decision to set up a deciding Game 3 and the right to head to the CNEBA final.

There, Lunenburg advanced via a 4-3 victory. Again, the Phillies won the game in walk-off fashion, this time on a sacrifice fly.

"I'm so proud of how our guys played throughout the playoffs," said Auburn coach Steve Economos. "Our pitching staff and defense was outstanding. We won our first playoff series in franchise history and then battled the defending champs and lost two games on walk-offs in the semifinals. We definitely made our presence known and we will be back and even better next year."

In Auburn's victory over Lunenburg, Ben Libuda tossed a complete game seven-hitter for the Rockets. Libuda, a tall southpaw, allowed one earned run and struck out a batter while walking five and hitting one.

"I thought we played a great game with Libuda leading us on the hill, he kept us in it the whole time. He battled, kept us in it and put us in the opportunity where our offense could do great work," said Economos.

But the Phillies struck first for an unearned run in the top of the first inning. Cooper Bigelow reached on a leadoff three-base error and later scored on a David Mason RBI groundout.

Despite losing the prior game, 1-0, and now trailing by the same score in Game 2, Economos knew that there was plenty of baseball to be played.

"I really wasn't worried," he said. "I knew Libuda would keep us in the game [and] I knew our lineup would be fine tonight. We've faced [Lunenburg starter Matt Morrisette] before and hit him before, so I knew we were going to score some runs."

Auburn ultimately smacked 10 hits off

Morrisette, including a pair in the bottom of the second to knot the score at 1-1. With Mike Vaitkunas on base, Anthony Higbie drove him in with an RBI single into right field.

The Rockets then took a 4-1 lead thanks to a three-run and three-hit third inning. There, Mykal Diaz roped a booming double to left field, plating both Connor Fahey (3-for-3) and Mason Mattero. Two batters later, Erik LaCaire brought Diaz home with another massive double to left.

All the while Auburn's defense protected the lead. In the second inning Mike Turco, the Rockets' catcher, slapped a tag on a would-be run for an out at the plate and later

threw over to third to pick off another runner. Auburn also turned double plays in the third and fourth innings.

"Our defense was fantastic," said Economos.

The Rockets took their 4-1 lead into the top of the seventh and, after Lunenburg scored a run on a Steve Lavoie (3-for-3, walk) RBI double, the Phillies continued to threaten with the bases loaded and two outs.

Libuda threw what appeared to be a perfect 0-2 pitch to Connor Wironen, but it was called a ball. Two pitches later, though, Wironen grounded out — ending the contest.

"The 0-2 could have rung up the game; he

didn't even say one thing. He grabbed the ball and finished off the game," Economos said of Libuda's strong mound presence.

Then, in the deciding Game 3, Jared Buckley threw a complete game five-hitter. Mattero also hit a three-run homer to tie the score at 3-3. But it wasn't enough, as the Phillies found a way to win and move on to face third-seeded Clinton in the championship series.

"I'm so proud of these guys. We all knew we had a good team, good kids. Last year we didn't even win a playoff game. To win a series, I'm so proud of how they've been playing," Economos concluded.

## HOW THEY GOT THERE

### Keeping it simple the key for Auburn to sweep Shrewsbury

AUBURN — Conor Scully and Travis Dinsdale combined to help lead Auburn past Shrewsbury in a first-round game of the Central New England Baseball Association playoffs, 5-1, at Auburn High's Memorial Field on Sunday, July 28.

With the win the Rockets, the final seed in the playoffs, swept their best-of-three series with the No. 4 Dirt Dogs, 2-0. Auburn defeated Shrewsbury, 3-2, in Game 1 of the series a day prior at Shrewsbury High. The Rockets advanced to the semifinal round where they played the top-seeded Lunenburg Phillies in a best-of-three series July 30-Aug. 1.

The playoff series win over Shrewsbury was the first in franchise history for Auburn, which is just a second-year program.

Scully, an Auburn High product and rising senior at Western New England University, hurled a complete-game four-hitter, allowing just one unearned

run while striking out five and not walking a batter.

"Scully was unbelievable today," Auburn coach Steve Economos said. "He was dealing the whole game. His leadership out there on the mound really carried us."

Scully's approach on the bump against the Dirt Dogs was a simple one.

"I just tried to pound the zone and let my defense do the work," the right-hander said. "I trust the guys behind me — and Mason [Mattero] behind the plate — completely. That allows me to pitch to contact if I have to because I know they're going to be there to back me up. I felt great out there today."

Scully's defense did back him up, committing just one error. First baseman Mykal Diaz handled four chances (two pop-ups, two groundouts) on his own flawlessly, while centerfielder Erik LaCaire and right fielder Andrew Mastrototaro recorded three putouts each. Dinsdale, the left fielder, also had a pair of putouts.

When not tracking down fly balls in left Dinsdale was on fire at the plate, going 3-for-4 with two doubles, a triple and two RBI.

"Travis led us offensively today," Economos said. "To double twice, triple and drive in two runs as the leadoff hitter was huge. He got us going every inning he got up."

Dinsdale, like Scully, said he just tried to keep his approach at the plate simple.

"I felt good at the plate today; I've been seeing the ball well lately. I've been going up there confident and relaxed. I've been trying to make sure I'm going with the pitch. I've just been hitting the ball where it's placed," said Dinsdale, a Worcester resident who

played collegiately at Dean College in Franklin. "Starting off the game with a double is huge. As a leadoff hitter you want to set the tone early and that double seemed to do it."

Auburn took a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning. Dinsdale got things going with the aforementioned double, moved to third on a single by Mastrototaro and scored to make it 1-0 on a sacrifice fly to left field by Connor Fahey. Mastrototaro went from first-to-third on a single by Mattero (two hits) and then put the Rockets ahead, 2-0, when he scampered home on a groundout by Diaz.


After Shrewsbury cut the Auburn lead in half in the top of the third inning with an unearned run, the Rockets came back with four runs in the bottom of the fourth inning to take a commanding — with the way Scully was pitching — 5-1 lead.

Mike Vaitkunas started things off by reaching on a Shrewsbury error. He then scored to give Auburn a 3-1 lead when the next batter, Anthony Higbie (single, double, RBI), doubled to left-center field. Higbie went to third on a bloop single by LaCaire and then Higbie and LaCaire both scored — to make it 5-1 — on a booming triple to right field by Dinsdale.

Leading the way for Auburn in its 3-2 Game 1 win was pitcher Jared Buckley, who tossed a complete game and allowed just two unearned runs, and Diaz, who was 3-for-3 at the plate.

"Our pitching staff has been unbelievable the past two days," Economos said. "Jared and Conor combined to throw 14 innings and not allow an earned run. Because of that we're set up pretty good going into the series with Lunenburg."






