'Tis the season for craft fairs

With the holiday season around the corner, people have already begun seeking places to get gifts, ornaments, and other Christmasy things. While some have no problem hitting the malls and chain stores, others would much rather find quirky, unique and handmade things that have character.

For them, there are a long list of arts and crafts fairs over the next month around the region, some of them long-running, some just being born.

The list starts this weekend at Pine Ridge Country Club in Oxford with the "One-Stop Holiday Shop," run by Dawn Oxnard.

'This will be a family-friendly shopping adventure where you can hopefully cross a bunch of names off your list," its Facebook page states, noting its aim is "supporting local women in business.

At the day's core, though, is a "superhero-themed" fundraiser for the family of Devin Suau, who died last month at age 6 of what his obituary dubbed "a terribly underfunded and unknown cancer" abbreviated DIPG. Officially called Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma, Dana Farber's website describes it as "highly aggressive and difficult to treat tumors found at the base of the brain. About 300 children, usually between ages 5 and 9, get this diagnosis annually, but the tumors "do not generally appear in adults," it adds.

"I ordered superhero masks for everybody [vendors and volunteers, that is] and people are encouraged to come as their favorite superhero," Oxnard said, noting a friend of hers is close to Devin's family.

This is the sixth fundraiser vendor fair her group, the Bay State Network, has done, but she also did similar things when living in Rhode Island, she said. It will feature "a huge raffle table with items from each of the 28 vendors." Before and after the event, people can donate by sending checks to #whynotdevin, PO Box 755, Framingham, MA 01701, with the money seeding a foundation to support further research into and treatment for this illness.

The following weekend, Nov. 18, there are at least two fairs nearby, and "many people make the loop of craft fairs that day," said Stephanie Nikopoulos, who is promoting Overlook's 26th annual Holiday Craft Fair in Charlton.

'This is 100 percent run by the residents," she said, noting the money from table fees, food and other things is the primary source of funds for an annual \$1000 scholarship awarded to four residents or family members annually.

"I've never had a problem attracting vendors, and a lot of town people know it's that day," she added.

Although some fairs (including

Pine Ridge's) will have Santa stop by, Nikopoulos said Overlook tried that a couple years ago and it didn't really work. "It's not really something kids come to," she said.

He'll probably be at Shepherd Hill's Festival of Crafts that same day, though. For 26 years, that event has raised funds for the school's Chorus program. That event's site includes a very long list of area crafters who are involved, and is already seeking vendors for next year's festival.

One of them is Imelda Lundstrom of Southbridge, who makes American Girl doll clothing out of recycled fabrics. She started tabling at the festival about five years ago and said she does about five fairs during the Christmas season, with many of her customers being older adults who "are still working and don't have the inclination to make doll clothes," so they buy hers.

You're not really making a lot of money, but I'm not there with other people, laughing with children, sharing American history," she said. She added that she especially enjoys promoting the American Girl book series, which highlights a wide range of girls doing things in historical settings, teaching about the past while providing strong messages of young female empowerment. "That's exciting for me.

Lundstrom said she finds a key aspect of the fair "precious" -- the fact the students who staff it are mostly in costume, singing songs and otherwise "making it fun." Each vendor is met by students in reindeer outfits who help carry material to their tabling location, among other things.

Combined all of the area's craft fairs represent only a tiny fractions of the "nearly 310,000 people employed by the creative economy in New England -working within and organization or freelancing -- who combined [to] earn nearly \$17 billion a year," according to the June 2017 "Jobs in the Creative Economy" study by the New England Foundation for the Arts (NEFA). "This group is a more prominent part of New England's economy than the national average....'

Many have a regular job besides the creative one that might bring them to a craft fair: some make a living at their art, writing or crafting and would therefore be included in NEFA's "70,800 creative non-employers, most of which are self-employed individuals." Of them,

half report "using their home as their primary work space, so their home life and work life are intimately intertwined," it found.

In general, NEFA found the creative economy has been harder hit by the long-running recession than most economic sectors, but some aspects have actually done well. "Most of the job losses have been concentrated in the manufacturing, wholesale and retail sectors of the creative economy ... while those sectors that rely on an audience (e.g. artists, museums, theaters, etc) have remained stable or have grown over time," it states.

According to Bankrate.com as of 11/13 the rate on a 30 year fixed loan was 3.80% compared to 3.95% just 2 months ago. Depending on when you last refinanced your home it may make sense to evaluate if you can lower your payment now by refinancing especially if you didn't have equity in the past causing you to not be able to refinance your loan.

Today we have 1846 single family homes for sale in Worcester County compared to 6 months ago where we had 1663 homes for sale or about a 11%

increase in homes for sale over that 6 month period but is down 8% form 2 months ago. It is a good sign to see the inventory dropping this month which is caused by homes selling but also many people taking their homes off the market with the

intention on waiting till the spring to sell again. The average days on market is currently 120 days while it was 121 days in May which tells me we are continuing to cycle through the inventory but slightly slower than 2 months ago. If





we look at homes sold over past 12 months compared to the same time for the previous year there is an almost 1.1% increase in sales and a 6.0% increase in sales price while it is taking over 20.6% faster to sell the homes this year than

last year in Worcester County. This shows that prices are still rising and homes are still selling quicker than a year ago. However, the percentage increase in amount of sales and days to offer is slowly decreasing which just may mean the market is starting to stabilize.

These numbers are important to continue to review and they will show the direction that the market is going in so we are prepared when a shift in the market happens. At this point the numbers still are extremely healthy and it is a great sign to see our days on market only slightly increase and to see a slight inventory drop. As always hire a Realtor that knows your market and can tell you how this data directly affects you and your home buying or selling decisions.

anything to get crazy over."

By happenstance, in 2008, Mulvehill, originally from New York, and Distefano, born in New Jersey, met when they were both living in Sutton and their kids were in school together.

Mulvehill said, "One thing I learned very quickly from my experience was that you really need to brew with a partner. When it comes to bottling, packaging, cleaning, the whole process needs to be celebrated with somebody. So, I asked Brian to join me."

The pair started brewing on a regular basis, creating their own recipes and sharing with friends who, as it turns out, really liked their beer. They knew that they might be on to something.

Distefano said "Sitting out in the garage, brewing and talking, we started brainstorming about taking it to the next level. We both thought it was worth it to at least try.'

After trademarking their name, Purgatory Beer Company was born, and Mulvehill and Distefano began searching for a location. Through an extensive quest to find a space in the local area, Mulvehill discovered the Linwood Mill.

Distefano described it, "The

space was just bare cement floors, covered with oil stains, the ceilings were painted black, the I-beams were rusty, the walls were painted white and it smelled.

Two days after the pair signed the lease they received a call that there was a massive fire in their building. The damage was extensive, but Distefano said it turned out to be an incredibly lucky break. He explained, "The company above us owns some very high-end equipment that had to be taken out of the building because of the fire. With the equipment removed, we had the opportunity to sand blast the entire space."

Mulvehill added, "Every inch of the room was pulverized and cleaned off."

No small feat for the pair who still have full-time 'day jobs' in marketing and advertising.


After thousands of hours of demolition and renovation, including plumbing, wiring, and finish work, with the help of their friend Geoff Vincellette, the space has been totally transformed.

Using natural woods, exposed brick, and warm lighting, the Purgatory Beer Company taproom has a rustic and cozy vibe. There are several handmade wooden bistro tables to provide ample seating, and shelf bars throughout to rest a flight of beer for tasting. Each week, the taproom

changes its selections of brews. With names like 'Dirty Swan IPA, Firebox Double IPA, Crate Chocolate Milk Stout, and Murgatroyd Pilz Pale Ale, there is always something different and unique to sample. Although a full menu is not served in the taproom, local favorite, Maison De Manger (located just across the mill) brings in Bavarian-style pretzels with dipping sauces, and charcuterie boards (cash only). These amazing snacks pair well with all of the Purgatory offerings. Selections at Purgatory are

reasonably priced. Depending \$3, twelve and sixteen once pours range from \$5 to \$6.50, and a refillable growler will go for \$14-\$16. Tasting is encouraged as it states on the menu, "We could come up with some elaborate descriptions of how you will experience our beer. Instead, why not just drink it?"

The Purgatory Beer Company is located at 670 Linwood Ave. Building C of the Linwood Mills, in Northbridge. NHS for the past nine years. He explained his inspiration to become a music teacher, "When I was in middle school, the director of music for the city of Brockton came to a concert and wanted me to come play trumpet at the high school. I had been planning on attending a vocational school to start training to be a plumber. Once I met with Mr. Macrina I knew I wanted to go to Brockton High. He made it known that he believed in me and that I could excel at BHS with hard work and dedication. I liked that feeling and knew from that moment that I wanted to create that feeling for kids. When I got to UMass Amherst I met the marching band director, George Parks, and he helped me in many ways to get into the music department and to become the teacher I am today."

Verdone's primary instrument is the trumpet, however with his vast musical training he is able to play all of the traditional band instruments, allowing him to teach his students a wide array of pieces. He's also involved in music outside of NHS.

He explained, "For many years I was a trumpet player for a group called 'Better from a Distance'. It was a party band that played hits from the '70s through to today.'

He added, "I was also a sub trumpet player for a couple of bands in the Boston area.

Given Verdone's talent, and zest for teaching, it is not surprising that being a music teacher at NHS has impacted his life immensely. He said, "I don't look at this as coming to work every day. I get to come to school and make music with great kids who have a passion for the arts. I love what I do. I face new challenges every day, but I look at them as opportunities to grow and become a better person and teacher."

He added, "Hands down the best part of my day is working and interacting with our students. We have amazing kids here at NHS and I pride myself on trying to get to know as many as I can, especially the ones who are not involved in music or are not in any of my classes. Teachers make a difference every day and most of it comes creating meaningful relationships with the students that are based on trust, respect, and empathy.'

Verdone, who enjoys an eclectic array of music which includes jazz, funk, hip-hop, and Broadway, has found his niche is teaching the high school-aged

"The most rewarding thing is seeing students succeed and grow into the young men and women that will do great things in our world. The growth from freshmen year to senior year is amazing and we as high school teachers get to see that transformation every year. The most challenging thing is having to say good bye to my seniors at the end of the year. Most of them take my classes every single year and it is extremely bittersweet to see them go off to college and the work force, but I am always

proud with who they became." He added, "I am very thankful for my students and colleagues who play major roles in my life. Many of the teachers I work with have become life-long friends. I love hearing back from alumni and keeping track of all the amazing things that they do in their lives."

Verdone was nominated for the Music Educator of the Year award by his students. The lengthy process included an application, letters of recommendation, and a curriculum vitae. From hundreds of nominations, Verdone was selected as one of 25 semi-finalists to receive the award, which will be announced at Music & Arts' annual Midwest Reception on Dec. 21 in Chicago.

BVT Adams scholars make the grade

UPTON – As students await acceptance letters from colleges and universities around the nation, a tuition-free college education is one of the many options available to the 75 Blackstone Valley Tech students named recipients of the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship.

Each year, the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education awards the scholarship to students who earned scores of Advanced and Proficient on grade 10 MCAS tests in English language arts, mathematics, and science and technology/engineering (with at least one score of advanced) and earned a combined score within the top 25 percent of their school district.

Students who accept the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship and enroll as full-time students in a Massachusetts state university or college will receive a tuition-waiver for up to eight semesters, which must be completed within six years of the recipient's high school graduation. Recipients must also maintain at least a 3.0 grade point average during their enrollment.

Superintendent-Director Dr. Michael F. Fitzpatrick noted that last year, the John and Abigail Adams Scholarships were among nearly \$4 million in renewable scholarships and awards earned by Valley Tech graduates.

Valley Tech views college as a continuation of learning; many Valley Tech students simultaneously pursue a post-secondary education while retain-

ing employment in their vocational industry.





Keegan: what's happening in Uxbridge?

To the Editor:

This is not a rhetorical question, because citizens should be demanding straight answers to many questions on many fronts. For the present though, let's address the ZBA where members swear to weight equally all plusses and minuses of any proposal where Zoning Bylaws conflict. Admittedly, the ZBA is required to make a correct choice between 'denial' or 'accepting with conditions'- a hard balancing act.

In the case of the much-debated Cumberland Farms 'permitted' at the corner of North Main and Hazel streets, one should be puzzled by the ZBA decision-making process. Ironically, almost everyone involved, from initial to final decisions, has resigned...wonder why? With no quorum available to conduct old or new ZBA business to what board should citizens now turn for redress about anything?

Several issues, raised in the prolonged permitting process, were largely ignored: siting a busy operation in what is mainly a residential neighborhood (less two commercially re-zoned residences on North Main); safe passage of private & emergency vehicles on narrow Hazel Street; pedestrian safety; extended operating hours; noise and light pollution, etc. These are not without merit so perhaps the 'why' of the ZBA decision can be best explained by an overwhelming desire for new revenue trumping all else.

Among the ZBA conditions (13) placed on Cumberland Farms, how will these (3) contribute to being a 'good neighbor' as executives pledged: operating hours

from 5 a.m. to midnight; lights 'on' at 4:30 a.m. and 'off' by 12:30 a.m. daily; privacy fencing set at only six feet high? And missing from the conditions is mention of a maximum noise level from outside audio playing from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Go see their massive new structures in Hopedale or North Smithfield! Here, it will be as if an alien space ship landed in a particularly inappropriate spot. In my opinion, the ZBA could have been considerably more thoughtful on 10/04 about putting lipstick on this pig by requiring more 'neighborhood-friendly conditions'!

Moreover, hope of filling town coffers with gains in tax dollars may be dashed early- a For Sale sign is up already! How many more may be coming? With CF looming (literally) next door, who will bet on the likelihood of homeowners, who may want to get-out-of-Dodge, actually selling at higher prices? Time will tell if a net loss results, or if this decision creates the revenue windfall envisioned by the ZBA.

For now, the ZBA is non-functioning. and we face major loss of vital institutional knowledge with departures of Town Manager, Asst. Town Manager, Town Accountant/ Assistant, and School Superintendent, each integral components needed to run our town's 'engine'. What's happening In Uxbridge, because the ship-of-state seems badly adrift. If true, who will step forward to chart a new course?

for the presence of our loved ones. But it's important to look beyond just one day in November if you want your family to take part in your "abundance." If you want to ensure your financial resources eventually are shared in the way you envision, you will need to follow a detailed action





Surgically repaired wing helps Hendriks, Beavers soar past Leicester

WORCESTER — Of all the players, coaches, parents, families and friends thrilled and elated that Blackstone Valley Tech captured its first Central Mass. title in football on Saturday, Nov. 11, none was as thrilled or elated as BVT senior quarterback and captain Reece Hendriks.

The top seeded Beavers defeated No. 2 Leicester High, 21-14, to win the Central Mass. Division 7 championship on Saturday Nov. 11 at Commerce Bank Field at Foley Stadium. It was the second time BVT beat the Wolverines this season.

Twenty-six days ago Hendriks thought that his high school football career was over. Even if the Beavers made it to the title game, he would not be on the field, thanks to the broken right collarbone he suffered in an Oct. 16 win over Bay Path Regional.

But there Hendriks was on Veterans Day, leading the Beavers' offense past Leicester and helping the winning cause by completing 5 of 9 passes for 62 yards and a touchdown and running the ball three times for

"If there's a tougher kid in Central Mass., I haven't seen him," Valley Tech head coach Jim Archibald said. "He's out there playing with a rod in his shoulder, which is keeping everything together. He's as tough as nails. He really answered the bell for us today.'

Yes, you read that correctly. Hendriks was playing less than four weeks after having a rod inserted in his shoulder for sta-

"There was no way I was missing this game. A game as big as this one, you think I'm going to sit out? No way. This is what I live for," Hendricks said. "When the injury happened I was heartbroken. But, fortunately, I had surgery right away and the doctors put the rod in and the collarbone quickly healed around the rod. One of my doctors, he said the injury was healing quicker than he had ever seen before. When

he said that, I knew it had to mean something. I knew I had a chance to play.'

The Beavers jumped out to a 6-0 lead on their second possession of the game, taking advantage of a short field after Leicester had to punt from deep in its own territory. BVT needed five plays to march 36 yards, senior Conner Polymeros capping the drive with a three-yard

Despite the Beavers dominating play throughout the first half, the game was still a one-possession affair with time winding down before halftime. That's when Leicester began to make a series of errors that resulted in 15 points for BVT, who went in to the locker room with a 21-0 lead.

The Wolverines' first mistake

was Kyle Padeni's decision to call for a fair catch at his own four-yard line on a punt that was going to carom off the Foley Stadium turf and go into the end zone, which would have given Leicester the ball at its own 20. On the first play following the fair catch the Wolverines were called for a false start, which moved the ball back to the twovard line. On the next play quarterback Dan Mero handed the ball off to Padeni, but Padeni could not get out of the end zone and was tackled for a safety, pushing the Beavers' lead to 8-0.

On the ensuing free kick BVT's Sam Niro caught the ball at his own 45-yard line and returned it to the Leicester 42. The Beavers needed just seven plays to score, Niro bulling in from the one-yard line to push

the BVT lead to 14-0 with 38.8 seconds to play in the half.

Leicester fumbled the ensuing kickoff and the Beavers' Ethan Lynch recovered the ball on the Leicester 33. BVT quickly drove to the Wolverines' fiveyard line, getting there with just two seconds to play. On the final snap of the half Hendriks found Conner Christensen in the left corner of the end zone as time expired.

'The last three minutes of the first half we made a ton of mistakes; I don't even know what team that was out there for us," Leicester head coach Tim Griffiths said. "The mental error after mental error in that stretch is what cost us the game. It was just God-awful. The whole first half was a comedy of errors on our part."

Leicester rallied in the second half, scoring a pair of

touchdowns while keeping the Beavers out of the end zone.

On the second play of the third quarter, Mero found Billy Roberts, the Wolverines' senior wide receiver, for a 47-yard scoring strike, to cut the Beavers' lead down to 21-7. Leicester then trimmed Valley Tech's lead down to 21-14 with 4:47 to play when Mero hooked up with Jack O'Neill on a 60-yard touchdown toss.

The Beavers, however, ran out the clock on the ensuing possession, driving from its 34-yard line to Leicester's five-yard line before time expired.

Valley Tech (10-0) will play Western Mass. champion Wahconah (9-1) in the state semifinals back at Foley Stadium on Saturday, Nov. 18 for an 11 a.m. kickoff. The Wolverines (7-3) next play at David Prouty Regional on Thanksgiving.


