DOUGLAS — Two years ago, the Douglas Adult Social Center held its first pancake breakfast and had planned to make it an annual event. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic stopped that from happening last year.

But now, local seniors recently enjoyed a pancake breakfast once again at the Douglas Adult Social Center.

“We were thrilled to be able to have it again,” said Douglas Adult Social Center Director/Outreach Case Manager Patrice Rousseau. “The seniors look forward to seeing them cook and serve breakfast.”

Douglas Board of Selectmen Chair Kevin Morse, David Cortese and his wife, Andrea, and Lori Burrows from State Representative Joseph McKenna’s office joined the breakfast and cooked pancakes, Rousseau said.

“It was a very difficult 16 months for seniors being shut in alone. Afraid to go anywhere and it seemed as if there was no end in sight,” Rousseau said. “I have seen first-hand how this isolation impacted their physical and mental health and overall well-being.”

# Northbridge bond rating upgraded

NORTHBRIDGE — The town of Northbridge has recently announced that its S&P Global Bond Rating has been upgraded from “AA” to “AA+,” reflecting an improved financial performance.

The S&P Global (Standard and Poor) rating is not only for the town’s previously borrowed long-term obligation bonds, but for the next upcoming borrowing for the school project, said Town manager Adam Gaudette on behalf of the town’s Financial Team.

“This upgrade is a result of our conservative budgeting strategies that have led to an improved financial performance of fund balances, our recent history of surplus performance, and stable debt metrics, despite taking on significantly more debt in the past few years,” the town released in a statement, adding that the hope and expectation is that this rating will benefit the town with “the borrowing costs associated with the upcoming school debt, but additionally with the eventual debt for the Fire Station Project.”

This news falls on the heels of the first borrowing for the new school project where the town borrowed \$30 million at 2.719 percent but received a \$1.8 million bond premium with a net rate of 2.797 percent, according to reports, saving an estimated \$5 million in borrowing costs.

Most recently, the town did a BAN for the DPW project and Turf Field project where they borrowed \$3.5 million at 1 percent, which equated to 0.3506 percent net with a \$24,000 bond premium, the town released.

“The rating reflects our view of the town’s strong and stable local economy, with property values rising an average of 4.5 percent annually new residential and commercial developments ongoing,” the Rating Summary reads. “In addition, the rating is supported the town’s very strong reserve levels of over 18 percent for fiscal 2020 and stable financial performance, with surplus results in five of the past six years...Overall, we expect the town will manage its increasing fixed costs as well as its retirement liabilities.”

# Northbridge awarded grant funding for Housing Rehabilitation Program

NORTHBRIDGE — The town of Northbridge has been awarded grant funding that will provide financial and technical assistance to eligible residential property owners to make repairs to their homes.

The grant is from the Massachusetts Department of Housing & Community Development, according to Northbridge Town Planner R. Gary Bechtholdt II, and the Northbridge Housing Rehabilitation Program (NHRP) will be administered through Community Planning & Development.

The program has funding to provide assistance for “improvements to approximately 14 housing units.”

“The purpose of the program is to correct code violations and sub-standard housing conditions, including abatement of health hazards such as lead paint and asbestos,” Bechtholdt said. “The program will address both existing

and incipient code violations.”

“One to four-unit owner-occupied and investor-owned residential properties located in Northbridge” are eligible for the program, according to reports. In order to qualify for assistance, a majority of the residential units in a property must be occupied by income-eligible households, which may vary depending on number of units.

Northbridge property owners may submit a Housing Rehabilitation Program Application to Community Planning & Development. Applications received by 4 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 25, will be entered into a lottery to be held in the Selectmen’s meeting room at the Northbridge Memorial Town Hall (7 Main St., Whitinsville) on Thursday, Aug. 26, at 2 p.m.

“The lottery will establish a waiting list for the NHRP and determine the order in which applications will be activated for assistance,” Bechtholdt said. “Applications received after the lottery deadline will be accepted

and placed at the bottom of the waiting list in the order in which they are received.”





