### Uber 911 safety integration now available across all of Massachusetts

Uber today announced that it is rolling out its 911 information sharing program to the entire state of Massachusetts. This means that when a rider or driver uses the in-app emergency button to call 911, key trip details will be automatically sent to 911 dispatchers in an emergency. The product is available in other cities and counties in the United States, but Massachusetts is the first place in the country where it's available statewide.

Uber first introduced the emergency button for all riders and drivers in 2018. The feature shows GPS location and car details (make, model, color, and license plate) in the app so that when a rider or driver taps Uber's emergency button to call 911, they can tell dispatchers that information.

Uber has partnered with RapidSOS to pilot 911 integration with local emergency authorities. This technology allows the rider or driver's

exact location (even as the car is moving) and car make/mode, color and license plate number to be sent to the 911 center electronically. The feature was made available in Boston and Springfield in September 2018 and in Cambridge in February

"Safety is at the heart of everything we do, and we believe technology can help make the roads safer than ever before. Every second counts in an emergency, and we want to make sure our users get help quickly with accurate information faced with an emergency situation," said Chad Dobbs, Head of Rides for Uber in Massachusetts.

"I am happy to see that 911 this enhancement has been expanded to our community and throughout the state. With many of our residents, young adultsandcollegestudentsusing Uber to get in and out of the city,

#### Rallying for the future

WORCESTER — Several hundred area residents joined millions of other people in hundreds of world cities on Friday, Sept. 20, rallying to urge leaders to take the climate crisis seriously.

In Worcester, the City Council became one of the few municipal governments so far to approve a "Climate Emergency" resolution pledging to become carbon neutral by 2030, among other things.

The concept, and countless protests worldwide, are being spurred by growing concern over scientific reports from the International Panel on Climate Change and other bodies projecting increasingly dire consequences if the climate continues to warm. Largely due to growing concentrations of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere (primarily carbon dioxide and methane, both of which are significantly higher today than they were a century ago), scientists argue we're seeing more severe storms, more erratic weather patterns, desertification in some areas, and an overall increase in global temperature. That temperature varies greatly by region; in some, like the Arctic, it's rising very rapidly; in others, it may even be cooling.

According to data from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration website, the global average is now 0.79 deg C (1.42 deg F) above the 20th-century average, with almost all of that warming happening since 1980. Projections

### Community Development Block Grants awarded to local communities

BOSTON — Representative Todd M. Smola (R-Warren, Ranking Member, Committee on Ways & Means) is pleased to announce that the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) recently awarded \$34 million to support a variety of housing, community and economic development projects in 63 cities and towns across the Commonwealth. Several communities in the First Hampden District were among those awarded funding through the Community Development Block Grant Program:

Holland, Brimfield and Wales will receive \$565,300 for

housing rehabilitation assistance to 13 units, a planning study for a senior center, support for a food pantry, and social service assistance for domestic violence prevention.

Palmer will receive \$825,000 to provide housing rehabilitation to five units, Fairview Street sidewalk improvements, and domestic violence prevention.

Ware and Hardwick will receive \$903,434 to provide housing rehabilitation assistance to 14 units, code enforcement, design work for New Braintree Road infrastructure improvements and social services assistance for domestic violence prevention, health services, literacy services, and senior outreach.

Warren will receive \$800,000 for infrastructure improvements to Moore Avenue and Lombard Street.

"This is great news for community," said Representative Smola. "These funds will assist our local towns with a number or priorities ranging from infrastructure and housing projects to vital social service programs."

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program is a competitive grant program authorized

by Congress, funded under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 and is designed to help small cities and towns meet a broad range of community development needs. CDBG funds are allocated annually to the Commonwealth through the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and administered by DHCD.

today's farm stands. Cider in the 1800s was kept through the spring planning, summer heat, and into the harvesting of the following season so it could be enjoyed year-round. During Apple and Agriculture Days, costumed interpreters will be cooking and demonstrating the fermentation process using the ox-powered Cider Mill on-site.

For two days only during Apple and Agriculture Days, on Oct. 12 and 13, enjoy a special screening of Forgotten Farms in the Old Sturbridge Village Visitor's Center. This documentary-style film examines class divides in today's farm and food communities. Once at the center of a thriving local food economy, dairy farmers are often "forgotten" in today's new farming landscape, with New England alone losing over 10,000 conventional dairy farms in the past 50 years. Following the screening on Oct. 12, Old Sturbridge Village will host a panel discussion, featuring the film's director, Dave Simonds, producer, Sarah Gardener, local dairy farmers, and OSV's agricultural





for the future range greatly, largely dependent on whether atmospheric carbon keeps growing, levels off or declines. The best IPCC model (RCP 2.6) shows a roughly stable temperature slightly above that of the present through 2300. The worst (RCP 8.5) projects an increase that ranges from 3 deg C to more than 12 deg C above present by 2300. The wide range is in part because scientists do not yet have a good handle on numerous natural feedback loops that might be triggered by such events as melting permafrost and sea ice or ocean acidification.

Worcester's event organized by Climate Strike Worcester, a coalition of several regional envionmental groups. Participants primarily came from four Worcester colleges - Holy Cross, Worcester State, WPI and Clark — in marches to the City Hall rally site from WPI and Clark. Several older residents (one dressed like Greta Thunberg) and younger children were also involved, as were representatives of the state's Green-Rainbow Party, Socialist Alternative and Extinction Rebellion. One counter-protestor carrying a "useful idiots" sign also walked by the peaceful crowd.

The following recipes are not only easy to whip up; they'll also earn rave reviews from lucky recipients!

Pear Honey

This old fashioned recipe relies on fresh pears for its smooth, fruity flavor.

Ingredients: six cups of ground pears; five cups sugar; four cups crushed pine-

Directions: Peel and core pears. Process pears until coarsely ground. Add sugar to pears and cook down until mixture thickens (can take up to four hours). Add the crushed pineapple and continue to cook and stirring periodically until thick and of a syrup consistency. Once desired thickness is achieved, pour hot liquid into hot sterilized jars. Process is hot water bath for ten minutes.

Thanksgiving Pickled Eggs

For some New Englanders pickled eggs are as traditional as cranberry sauce on the Thanksgiving table. This recipe is sure to "hit the spot!"

Ingredients: eight eggs; 1 (15 ounce) cans beets with liquid; 1/2 cup white vinegar; 1/2 cup white sugar; 1/2 cup water; 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Directions: Hard boil eggs, cool and peel. In a medium saucepan combine beet liquid, vinegar, sugar, water and cinnamon. Bring to a boil and stir under sugar is fully dissolved. Pour

mixture over eggs. Place egg in a saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring water to a boil and immediately remove from heat. Cover and let eggs stand in hot water for 10 to 12 minutes. Remove from hot water, cool, and peel. Pack eggs loosely into canning jars. Pour bet mix-

ture over eggs. Chill for at least four hours before eating.

Note: Pickled eggs should be refrigerated, not processed. Refrigerated pickled eggs can last up to ten days in the refrigerator.

Sweet and spicy, a fiesta of spices elevates this salsa from simple to sen-

Ingredients: 9 cups fresh peaches, chopped; 2 tablespoons lime juice (fresh or bottled); 4 cups fresh tomatoes; 2 large bell peppers, diced; 1 large red bell pepper, diced; 2 cups sweet onions; ; 1 cup vinegar; 3 garlic cloves, chopped; 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper; 3 tablespoons honey; 1 tablespoon crushed red pepper flakes

Directions: Peel, pit, and dice peaches, and mix with lime juice. Peel and chop tomatoes. Combine all fresh fruits and vegetables in a large stainless steel pot. Add vinegar, honey, cilantro, cayenne, and crushed red pepper. Bring mixture to boil over medium heat. Cook for about three minutes, stirring frequently. Turn heat to simmer for three minutes more.

Ladle salsa into hot sterilized canning jars, leaving 1/4 inch headspace. Screw on band tightly and process in a hot water bath for ten minutes. Makes a dozen half pint jars.

Gift Tip: Present a jar of peach salsa with a spice packet of Old Bay seasonings for grilled fish. This lets the recipient know this salsa is not just for dipping tortillas!

### Youth deer hunt passes, while pheasant hunting approaches

This past Saturday the one day youth deer hunt was held in Massachusetts. The annual event allows a young hunter 12-17 to hunt deer with a licensed adult hunter, with a special permit from Mass. Fish & Wildlife. They can hunt with a bow or a shotgun. This past Saturday young Tyler was hoping for another harvested deer with his bow, no report as of this deadline.

This week's picture shows Tyler with his first doe he harvested with his dad a few years ago using his shotgun.

Upland bird hunters in Mass. are gearing up for the Oct. 19 opening of pheasant hunting. A few clubs received their Pheasant from Mass. Fish & Wildlife a number of weeks ago, and the results of their success in raising the pheasant are great this year. The clubs

that raise pheasant from the state are required to stock the birds in open covers that are accessible to all Mass. licensed hunters.

Concerned local bird hunters are worried about West Hill in Uxbridge being stocked this year with pheasant because of a dispute with an abutting land owner, which has shut down access to a section of the West Hill. There should not be a problem, as the access to the site can be made at the Dam area on Hartford Ave.! It was used for years prior to the shutdown for access to the hunting site and hopefully it will be used this year if no changes or settlements are made with the abutting landowner. Unfortunately, hunters will have a longer walk to the hunting areas, as they will need to park at the parking lot off of Hartford Ave. Stay Tuned!

Hunting open covers in October will no longer offer great hunting for Woodcock and Grouse locally because of the near extinction of grouse in the valley, and the low populations of woodcock in the area due to lost habitat. The word upland bird hunting is rarely used by this writer, because of



the loss of these two great game birds in the valley area. Areas in other parts of the state also no longer have the woodcock and grouse populations they once had, but are not in as bad a shape as were are.

Flights of woodcock do provide some limited shooting if you are in the right place at the right time. Owning a good pointing bird dog can provide some fast shooting on these birds that are often called timber doodles. When the woodcock flush they often rise straight up, giving the hunter a somewhat easy shot. The whistle of the bird when they take flight is a great sound, and gives the hunting a slight edge in making a good shot. Numerous bird dogs do not like the taste of woodcock in their mouth as they have a livery taste, but other dogs are not bothered by the taste.

Woodcock are great table fare if they are prepared correctly, and it takes quite a few birds to make a meal for the family. People that cook with numerous wines make the taste of the bird a lot sweeter, while grouse do not need any special dressings or preparation.

The Salmon River continues to give up some impressive Coho salmon for anglers that are fishing there now. They had a good dose of rain last week in the area, and that is good news, helping to move the fish upstream.

Fish stocks of some species in the saltwater are being devastated by Cormorants and seals. These protected species are causing serious damage to our winter flounder populations, especially in Rhode Island waters. The winter flounder fishing is nearly non-existent in the Narragansett Bay area for years now because of cormorants. In past years I have watched these birds eat hundreds of the recently hatched winter flounder in Rhode Island waters.

Seals eat massive amounts of fish daily and their populations continue to rise annually also. Something needs to be done soon. The commercial fishermen cannot be all to blame for our dwindling fish stocks in Rhode Island and Massachusetts. Numerous attacks by sharks are also becoming more frequent because of the out of control of seal populations. There should be some type of control of these two angelies.

# If it were easy, would everyone really be doing it?

I find it fascinating how the most successful people I know are rarely the most talented. It doesn't matter ... whether it's business, inter-personal relationships, the arts, sports ... the people who achieve the greatest heights all

share a single quality that propels them above others. It's not talent, intelligence or luck. It's not knowing the right people or being in the right place at the right time. What is it that the successful have that others do not?

Persistence.

Successful people simply do not quit. They don't give up. I've told the story before, but it's appropriate to do so again.

I'm the author of three successful books. To begin writing a book isn't hard, but completing the task is monumental. There are thousands of people out there that have a book in their head and heart. They began writing with passion but at some point, early in the writing process, they stop. Starting and completing a book project of eighty thousand words or so is a monumental task that few ever complete. Why do they stop? They do not have the persistence to finish. Now let's look at the very few who do finish. Writing the book, as difficult as it is, is easier than getting published. My first book, "Playing with the Enemy," was rejected seventy-four times by publishers. It was the seventy-fifth that took a chance on an inexperienced and unknown author and "Playing with the Enemy" became a surprise hit. A surprise to everyone but me. I knew if I could get it published, the book would resonate with audiences. That belief is what drove me to not quit.

What would happen if you didn't

How many talented baseball players left their dreams of major league stardom behind because they gave up too soon? How many artists or musicians stopped short of the coming success they could have enjoyed? How many marriages end in divorce because one or both parties in the relationship just decide to give up? In each case, they didn't have the persistence to see it through to a successful end.

Is persistence the only quality needed to succeed?

Of course not, but it is the most important. Who really thinks Johnny Cash or Bob Dylan had a great singing voice? They had talent to be sure but I'm certain I can find someone within five miles of my home with a better voice.

So, if persistence is most important, where and how do I get it?

Persistence is driven by your belief system. If you believe you have talent or ability, that belief drives your success. If you don't believe, sell yourself! Face it, if you think you don't have a chance, why would you try?

It's rarely the most talented that achieve the pinnacle of success. Of course, talent

matters, but ability is something that can be achieved through dogged determination. Sticking with your dream and driving to greater heights through practice, study and a passionate drive that always ask the question: If others can reach the top and achieve their dreams, why not me?

My dad had a simple statement that is applicable. If I were to ask him why most people don't succeed, he'd respond, "It's easier not to ..." Apply that as the answer to almost any ques-

Why aren't you disciplined? It's easier not to be. Why weren't you on time? It's easier

not to be.

Why didn't you stay and work on your marriage? It's easier not to work

Why won't you quit smoking? It's easier not to quit.

Why aren't you a good student? It's easier not to get good grades.

Why didn't you get that promotion? It's easier not to get it.

Why are you not financially successful? It's easier not to be.

Why didn't you finish that book you were writing? It's easier not to finish.

Apply that answer to almost any question of success or achievement and it is almost always true. It is easier not to succeed. Success takes persistent hard work. It takes the attitude that screams that you will not be denied the success you desire. It requires that dogged persistence that says, yes, it's easier to quit, but you are willing to stick to the task at hand and pay the price for success. As the old adage proclaims, "If it were easy, everyone would be doing it!"

The truth is, if you dig in and not quit, you will find the only resistance is you. If you chisel away the resistance, you will find a clearer path to your success.

Take the road less traveled. The vast majority will always say, "It's easier not to." In a world dominated by those unwilling to pay the price, success is there for the taking for those who do.

It's never too late.

ly predictable pattern: When stock market rises, more people invest, but after a large-scale

drop, many of these same people head for the exits. But by staying out of the financial markets, and only putting their money in "safe" vehicles that offer few or no growth prospects, are they really helping themselves? Here's the bottom line: If you're going to make progress toward your long-term goals, you have to become a long-term inves-

To begin with, you need to understand that long-term investing involves accepting inevitable short-term price swings. 



But, if we don't execute and we shoot ourselves in the foot with penalties like we did in the first half, one taking a touchdown off the board, we're putting ourselves in bad situations. After a scoreless third quarter, Tantasqua went to work on its game-winning comeback.

The Warriors took the lead, 14-8, Gore scoring on a fiveyard run and Sears rushing for the two-point conversion. Gore's score capped a 13-play, 65-yard drive.

Tantasqua got the ball to start the drive after Owen Stanton blocked a 39-yard field goal attempt by Westborough, a field goal attempt that came after the Rangers' 13-play drive, which took 7:50 off the clock, stalled at the Warriors' 22-yard line.

Westborough's ensuing drive was a 10-play affair, but it too stalled and the Rangers were forced to punt, the ball being downed at the Tantasqua 17-yard line.

Sears, who rushed for 126 yards in the second half, gained 76 yards on the ensuing drive, the last 45 coming on a touchdown run that started off left tackle before he bounced it outside and sprinted down the sideline and into the end zone.

'Today for me was just another day at the office," Sears said. "My linemen work for me and I work for them; it's give and take."

STURBRIDGE — There are few high school boys' varsity soccer teams that face a mustwin game in the first half of the season, but that was the case for Tantasqua Regional in its game with visiting Auburn High on Wednesday, Sept. 25.

The Rockets entered the game undefeated and unscored upon, but the Warriors netted a pair of goals in the first 20 minutes and three in the first half en route to defeating Auburn, 2.1

Tantasqua improved to 7-2 overall and 6-1 in the Southern Worcester County League (SWCL) with the win, while knocking Auburn out of the ranks of the unbeaten teams. The Rockets are now 5-1-2 overall and 5-1-1 in the SWCL.

"This was definitely a measuring-stick game for us; this was one we knew we had to have," Warriors' head coach Matt Guertin said. "I thought

we played very well in the first half in terms of our execution."

Tantasqua jumped out to a quick 1-0 lead in the fifth minute of the game, senior Kai Von Bleicken gathering in a left-toright direct kick from about 20 yards out by junior Ethan Bergeron and booting it into a wide open Auburn net.

"Our goalkeeper, Coleman Picard, slipped and fell down on the direct kick and because of that was unable to have a chance to make a play on the ball," Auburn head coach Chris Bailey said. "That completely changed the game for us. If Coleman is able to make a play on that ball and the game stays 0-0, then their second goal is their first goal and at 1-0 it's still anybody's game."

The Warriors' second goal was scored in the 19th minute by senior Roger Leland, who re-directed a pass into the middle of the field by freshman Paddy McGrath past Picard to put Tantasqua ahead, 2-0. The

goal was Leland's eighth of the season.

Tantasqua extended its lead to 3-0 with 7:30 left in the first half, senior Sam Valcor scoring his first goal of the season on a shot that bounced past Picard.

Auburn looked as if it may make things interesting in the second half, scoring off a corner kick three minutes after intermission to cut its deficit to 3-1. Senior Mike Breen scored for the Rockets, leaping high in the air to head the ball past Tantasqua goalie Cooper Hurt after a perfect kick in by classmate Sam Almeida.

Unfortunately for the Rockets it was the only ball they could get past Hurt, who finished with five saves. Hurt and the Tantasqua defense kept Auburn away from the Warriors' net for the rest of the second half.

"We knew they were going to take it to us in the second half and they did," Guertin said. "We knew coming in they were a good team with a good goalie and that we were going to have to play a solid 80 minutes if we hoped to beat them.

"But, we struggled in the second half and didn't move the ball as well as we did in the first half," Guertin continued. "I thought we played a good 40 minutes [the first half] in this game; or maybe a good 60. I thought Auburn got to us a little in the second half."

Tantasqua's three goals were the first goals Picard — who finished with nine saves — has allowed all season. Despite that, Bailey said he is not worried that his goalkeeper will go into a funk because the Warriors got to him.

"I have no worries at all about Coleman," Bailey said. "He is a great goalie and a stellar athlete. I have all the confidence in the world in him. I don't think he'll allow a total of three [more] goals the rest of the season."

### Match food to your favorite brews



The rise of craft and home brewing has created more beer flavor profiles than ever before. In fact, there's likely a beer for everyone, whether you're a novice or connoisseur.

The Brewer's Association, a trade association that represents small and independent American craft brewers, reports that, in 2018, small and independent brewers collectively produced 25.9 million barrels and experienced a 4 percent total market growth. The BA also states that these small brewers achieved a collective retail dollar take-in of \$27.6 billion.

While wine will always have its enthusiasts, beer is fast on its heels as a popular mealtime beverage. Much in the way wines are paired with certain foods, it has become the natural course of action to pair certain foods with particular styles of

"Beer is a great match for food because of the complexity of its flavors, its ability to provide refreshment and to interact with many food flavors," says Marc Stroobandt, a master beer sommelier for the Food and Beer Consultancy, UK.

Although each person has his or her preferences, here is a brief listing of generalized pairings, courtesy of the Brewer's Association and CraftBeer.com.

Association recommends matching delicate dishes with delicate beers and strong dishes with assertive beers. Commonalities, like aromas and sub-flavors. also work together. A beer with roasted notes may pair well with chocolate, for example. Opposites also attract, in that a spicy food may taste best when paired with a sweet beer.

Pairing might once have been limited to matching wines with certain foods. But the booming craft beer business has popularized pairing flavorful beers with foods to make meals even tastier.

### What to know about food portions

Portion control is a big part of a healthy diet. In fact, the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases notes that, when it comes to maintaining a healthy weight, how much food a peron eats is just as imp what he or she eats. No two people are the same,

When trying to determine their calorie needs, men and women should consult with their physicians, who will consider their lifestyle, age, medical history, and other factors before advising patients about how much they should eat.

What if I am still hungry after reducing portion sizes?

It's likely that people accustomed to big portions will still be hungry as their bodies adjust to reduced portion sizes. In such instances, people can try taking more time to eat. Even if there's less food on the plate, eating slowly gives the brain a chance to receive the



message that the stomach is full. According to the NIDDK, it can take as long as 15 minutes for that message to make its

way to the brain. Eating slowly reduces the risk of overeating, and you may even be surprised to learn that a smaller portion

size than you're used to is all you really need to feel satisfied. Portion control is a great way to get healthy and main-

tarian lifestyle for a number of reasons. Some individuals have an aversion to eating meat because they're concerned about animal welfare, while others find that a low-calorie, vegetarian diet promotes long-term health.

Ancient grains include spelt, teff, barley, sorghum, farro, and einkorn. These ancient grains are higher in protein than common grains.

· hemp seeds: These seeds come from hemp, which is in the same family as marijuana. However, hemp will not cause a high because it only has trace amounts of the THC compound that produces that effect. Hemp seeds contain 50 percent more protein than chia seeds and flax seeds, offers Healthline.

In addition to these foods, peanuts and other legumes, almonds, peas, oatmeal, spirulina, broccoli, brussel sprouts, and sweet corn also are good protein sources for vege-

Even though it may seem like skipping meat products would leave vegetarians lacking for protein, there really are quite a number of alternative protein sources out there.

### Skewered chicken goes great on the grill



Grilling chicken is an easy way to transform this versatile food into something even more delicious. Various cultures serve chicken in kebab form after grilling it over an open flame, and taste is a big reason this particular method of cooking chicken is so beloved.

While you might not expect to see kebabs on the menu at your favorite Italian restaurant, "spiedini" is Italian for "little skewers," proving that Italian chefs recognize how delicious chicken can be when served in kebab form. In this recipe for "Spiedini of Chicken and Zucchini with Almond Salsa Verde" from "Cooking Light: Dinner's Ready" (Oxmoor House) by The Cooking Light Editors, skewers are paired with a zesty salsa full of nuts, herbs and citrus,

which makes for the perfect complement to the smoky grilled flavor.

Spiedini of Chicken and Zucchini with Almond Salsa Verde Makes 6 servings

Salsa:

cup chopped flat parsley

tablespoons chopped almonds, toasted

tablespoons chopped fresh chives

tablespoons capers, chopped 3

teaspoon grated lemon rind 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

teaspoon chopped fresh thyme

teaspoon chopped fresh orega-1/2


Soak 12 (10-inch) wooden skewers in water for 30 minutes to prevent burn-

Bring the grill to medium-high heat To prepare the salsa, combine the first 12 ingredients; set aside.

To prepare the spiedini, thread the chicken and zucchini alternately on each of the 12 skewers. Coat the spiedini with cooking spray; sprinkle evenly with 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper. Place on a grill rack; grill 6 minutes or until done, turning once. Serve

Tip: Prepare the salsa up to a day ahead, and assemble the skewers earlier in the day. Coat with the seasonings just before grilling.
