Tree House receives approval for alterations

CHARTON – Tree House Brewing Company in Charlton is continuing to expand on their amenities at their 129 Sturbridge Rd. location with the recent approval of expanded interior and exterior space by the Board of Selectmen.

The company sent forth a request for alteration of premises to add 17,601 square-feet of interior public space and 43,251 of square-feet in exterior green space. Despite initial concerns from the Building Commissioner about the amount of exterior space selectmen received no objection from town officials for the proposal.

Selectmen approved the proposal with little debate with several board members reiterating past comments that the company has been a great addition to the community that has handled any issues and complaints with professionalism. Selectman John McGrath was particularly complimentary to the company saying he was glad to see them continue to build on their business.

"I'm very happy to see that they're expanding. I'm happy

that they came to Charlton over numerous other towns that they had the chance to go to. They've proven to be very good neighbors. They've done a lot of different things in the community and they worked with many different groups," McGrath said. "I'm extremely happy to see them moving forward with this."

A representative from Tree House Brewery explained that the project won't actually be expanding their operation, but instead is a way for them to "cover their bases." The areas have already been utilized for activities and operations and the initiative will not require more encroachment on wetlands or the removal of more trees. The company is currently working on a 16,000 square-foot addition previously approved by the town.

Selectmen did take the time to address some concerns about security for their parking area with the upcoming holiday season. Tree House Brewing Company has assured selectmen they maintain a staff of TIPS certified individuals that monitor the parking area

Selectmen show concerns about meal tax benefits

CHARTON – Charlton's selectmen are taking steps that they hope will ensure that the community reaps the financial benefits of hosting food trucks after it was discovered that the community is not benefitting as expected from the state's tax rules.

The Board of Selectmen discussed the matter at a meeting on Oct. 22 at the request of Selectman Bill Borowski. Under Massachusetts General Law food trucks are required to log in daily and enter their sales information online including listing the town or city they collected the majority of their sales from on that day.

The town where they spent the most time would benefit from the taxes raised. Selectman Borowski said he discussed the meals tax with a vendor at a recent event and discovered that the truck operators don't know where that money goes. More research indicated that Charlton is not receiving funding from these taxes despite

being a consistent host community.

"We all know food trucks come into town from time to time whether it be for an event. (A resident) simply asked me if they should be paying the meals tax and I honestly didn't know. I called the Department of Revenue and they told me they absolutely should,"

Borowski said. "To the best of my knowledge, we're not getting the money. It's probably a very small amount, but the reality is if it's being sold in town we should be getting that money as opposed to the food truck's home town which is where I'm guessing it's going so they're getting the benefits

School district approves new plowing contract

DUDLEY/CHARLTON – Whether we like it or not winter is upon us and that means the threat of snow is close at hand. With that in mind the Dudley-Charlton Regional School District has finalized contracts for plowing of the local school properties with three separate contracts agreed upon by the School Committee in late October.

The School Committee met on Oct. 23, where Director

of Finance and Operations Richard Mathieu revealed that with three different bid requests being sent out only three bidders, one for each RFP, sent in offers for consideration. All three were approved by the committee with each company taking one of the designated grouping.

Mathieu explained the details of the bid process to the School Committee explaining that of the three bidders two have worked with the town before and one is a new partner offering their services.

“The way that we put the bid out we bid the seven schools into three different groups. Group one would be Mason Road and Dudley Elementary School. Group two is Shepherd Hill and Dudley Middle School and group three is the other three Charlton schools,” Mathieu said. “The pricing on the bids is a little unique. We asked for a quote for each type of storm, one to three inches, four to six inches, seven to nine inches, 10 to 14 inches and 14 plus inches, a quote for only partial plowing as well as separate pricing for sanding. We put in an estimated number of storms and multiply it out over the course of three years.”

The companies signed on for the next three years through the bidding process were College Enterprises DBA C & C Plowing of Dudley Group 1, Shovan Enterprises of Dudley and Webster for Group 2, KMZ Snow Removal, a new bidder, for the Charlton Schools. Mathieu did note that the prices for Group 1 and Group 2 increased by 10 percent and 25 percent respectively through

the new contracts, but Group 3 actually saw a decrease in cost. The district will only pay on a per storm basis. The total cost of the bids for the three years ranges \$62,550 for Group 1, \$180,000 for Group 2 and \$170,000 for Charlton. Mathieu stressed that there is no guarantee this full budget will be spent and that no district has needed more than \$50,000 for plowing in any of the three years of the previous contracts.

CHARLTON — The town of Charlton would like to notify its senior residents of new guidelines for the Senior Tax Work-Off Program.

The Senior Tax Work-Off Program (MGL Chapter 59, Section 5K) gives qualifying seniors who are at least 60 years of age an opportunity to volunteer hours to a municipal department, and in return receive a \$1,500 abatement on their property taxes. (Income guidelines apply.) The program is funded for 20 participants.

If a person is eligible for the program, and is physically unable to put the hours in themselves, a volunteer may work in place of the eligible applicant by signing up through the program.

from receiving the benefits.

“One possible cause for that, if I read everything correctly, is that the food trucks only have to pay the meals tax to the town in which they sold the most that day, so if a food truck hits Worcester and does \$2,000 in sales and then comes to Charlton that night and does \$500 in sales they’re not obligated by state rules to pay us a penny,” Singer said.

He added that he didn’t agree with this practice and noted that out-of-state trucks aren’t even required to pay the tax calling that an “unfair competitive advantage.”

Selectman Borowski stated that regardless of the minimal benefit the town could receive from the tax, if Charlton should

be receiving money the taxpayers deserve to benefit from those fees. He requested that town officials come together to brainstorm solutions and to make sure that all food truck vendors are made aware of their responsibilities to the state tax. Charlton Health Director James Philbrook said that process should start with the permitting.

“I think when someone applies for a permit in town there should be some kind of rules that should be given to them to make sure they do the following and ask if they know there’s a local meals tax in Charlton,” Philbrook said. “Some of them just don’t know I believe because not every town has that.”

THE PURPLE POST Home Inspections Part 2

Welcome to our follow up article on Home Inspections. In the last article we discussed many important topics surrounding an inspection. We talked about what a home inspection is, what it includes, what is does not, what additional tests to ask your inspector about (such as radon), the Massachusetts form that your agent or Realtor is required by law to provide you with, how to find a licensed inspector etc... We covered a lot! Hence, the need to break down the topic across two separate articles.

We pick up now at the point where your inspection is complete. So now what? Are you satisfied with the results of the inspection and the condition of the home? If you are satisfied, then it's time to move forward and head to Purchase and Sales. Woo hoo!

If you're not quite satisfied, maybe there are some deficiencies that concern you significantly? If that is true, you may want to have a local expert examine the situation further. For example, the inspector pointed out that the roof could be a concern given the condition. The inspector will provide their opinion, point out the defects, look at the roof with binoculars... BUT they will not

climb on the roof to examine issues further. In this case, you may want to call a roofing contractor who will get up on the roof if needed and examine the condition as a roof expert to provide more finite details about the condition. The point is, if you would like to have certain experts/professionals look at certain defects that the inspector pointed out... you can. You're about to buy, arguably the biggest asset of your life, so you should be comfortable with the condition of the home prior to moving forward.

What about asking the seller to repair items or to giving money off the sale price we agreed to? Ok here's the deal... home inspection is not a negotiation tool. The purpose is to provide the buyer with information about the condition of a property. Now that said, one can request that certain items be repaired if there are concerns. What doesn't work is saying you are unhappy with the results so give me \$10,000 off (randomly) and I'll still buy it. Remember, it's not a negotiation tool. The process would be as follows. If you desire that one of more items be repaired/remedied by the seller you must ask your agent/Realtor to submit your requests in writing

to the listing agent. The list agent will discuss with the seller and one of a few outcomes are possible. 1.) They say “no” to repairing any items. If that happens your choice is live with that answer; buy the house anyway, or you can walk away from the deal and get your initial deposit back. 2.) They can say “yes” to some items and “no” to other requests- same deal, you could agree or not agree to this and act accordingly. 3.) They could say they don't want to formally do the repairs on the items but that they would be willing to provide a credit off the sale price to move forward. Estimates by contractors are the best way or determining the correct value for repairs; random numbers don't work well typically. We hope this has been helpful!





and that a private security firm called Lusignan has been hired to be on hand during all hour of open pours. The company has stated their willingness to maintain their security measures longer and beyond open pour hours if requested.

Gold and silver still lead the way at auction

The antique market has changed significantly since when I started in this business over 30 years ago. Back then many dealers were refinishing antique furniture and were making a good living reselling it. Brilliant cut glass, EAPG (early American Pattern glass), Heisey, Fostori and other glassware sold very well at shows and in antique shops. Limoges, Nippon and other china were also bringing strong prices. Baseball cards and comic books were selling well at local auctions, but not bringing the record prices we see today. Those who kept silver and gold they purchased decades ago have seen their investment grow over time despite the changing market.

Sterling silver hollowware and flatware, along with silver coins, have been among the best-selling items at auction for several years. Many people sold gold in 2001, when it reached over \$1,900 an ounce. Gold prices have been rising again, and it is now over \$1,500 an ounce. Many consignors have been selling their gold and sil-

ver again during this strong market. Pieces by silversmiths from the 18th and 19th century can fetch strong prices at auction. A soup tureen by master silversmith Paul Storr brought \$26,000 at a 2014 auction. More modern pieces by famous designers like Tiffany are also very valuable. A pair of nine-candle Tiffany sterling silver candelabras sold for \$93,500 at auction in 2012. A set of Tiffany “Renaissance” flatware brought \$98,000 in a 2014 auction. Two Tiffany sterling center bowls with hand hammered ocean scene designs reached \$111,500 when they sold at auction in 2012.

As you’d expect, gold items can bring prices that are even higher than silver. A 1795 \$10 Gold Eagle coin went for \$375,000 at auction in 2015. Gold jewelry can fetch astronomical prices, especially when combined with gemstones. A gold and diamond tulip bangle by JAR sold for \$3.5 million at a 2014 auction.

Most people don’t have 18th century silver or early 19th century gold



coins, but more recent silver and gold have also been selling well at our Worcester auctions.

A George Jensen Harald Neilsen Design sterling silver coffee and tea set sold for over \$2,000 in our August 2017 auction. A large Wedgwood pattern sterling silver flatware service by International Silver Company went for over \$3,000 in our August auction. A George Jensen flatware sterling set brought over \$4,000 in our January 2017 auction. A 1911 \$20 St. Gaudens gold coin brought \$1,400. A gold mourning locket went for over \$2,000 in our August 2016 auction. A set of 22-karat gold Western miniatures by Jim Pounder brought bids of over \$20,000 in our May auction. Precious metals continue to remain precious to our bidders.

We have our next major auction on January 30th in Worcester. I’ll be appraising items for the public at the First Parish Church United in Westford on November 9th from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Take greater
control of your
401(k)

If your employer offers a 401(k) or similar plan, you've got a powerful retirement-savings tool at your disposal. And yet, how well you do with your 401(k) depends greatly on your choices and actions. What steps can you take to maximize the benefits of your plan?

For starters, be aware that your 401(k) may come with what might be called “standard” features, which you should review to determine their applicability to your situation. These features include the following:

Default deferral rate – When you take a job, your employer may automatically enroll you in the company's 401(k) plan and assign a “default” contribution rate – the percentage of your salary you will put in to your 401(k). Many companies choose a default rate of 3 percent, although, in recent years, there has been a move toward higher rates, even up to 6 percent. Unfortunately, too many people don't question their default rate, which could be a problem, especially if it's at the lower end. If you want your 401(k) to ultimately provide you with as many financial resources as possible, you will likely need to contribute as much as you can afford. So, be aware of your default rate, and, if you can possibly afford it, increase that level. And every time your salary goes up, consider boosting your contributions.

Investment mix – When you're automatically enrolled in your 401(k), the amount you might initially contribute isn't the only “off the shelf” feature – you also might be assigned a default investment option. One common default investment is known as a target-date fund, which generally includes a mix of stocks, bonds and cash instruments. Your 401(k) plan provider, or your human resources area, will typically base this mix on your age and projected retirement date. Usually, this fund will grow more conservative over time, reflecting the need to reduce the portfolio's risk as you get nearer to retirement. However, you may not be obligated to stick with the default option. Most 401(k) plans usually offer several options from which to choose. Ideally, you'd want to spread your investment dollars among a mix of these investments to give yourself the greatest growth potential, given your risk tolerance and time horizon. And always keep in mind that your 401(k) is a long-term vehicle, designed to help you prepare for a retirement that may be decades away. Consequently, try to discipline yourself to look past the inevitable short-term drops in your portfolio.

Matching contributions – If your employer offers a 401(k) matching contribution, you should certainly take advantage of it. Consider this: If you employer matches 50 cents for every dollar you contribute, up to 6 percent of your pay, and you contribute the full 6 percent, you would, in effect, be receiving a 3 percent pay raise (50 percent of 6 percent). That's like a 50 percent rate of return even before you invest this added money.



Plan ahead for Amaryllis blooms all winter long

Let amaryllis fill your home with flowers for the holidays and keep the blossoms coming all winter long. When you plant several different types of amaryllis bulbs, from both the southern and northern hemisphere, you can be sure to get a long-lasting, colorful show that will brighten your mood and surroundings throughout the winter months.

Kick off the holiday season with amaryllis bulbs that are imported from growers in Peru. As we enter autumn, it’s springtime in South America, and these bulbs are eager to start blooming. Pot them up before early November for flowers in December.

Amaryllis varieties grown in the southern hemisphere include deep red Mandela, frosty white Denver, coral-pink Bolero and two-tone Charisma. Combine these impressive blossoms with greens, poinsettias, candles and other holiday décor, or give them as living gifts to friends, family and neighbors.

Most amaryllis bulbs that are grown in the U.S. are imported from Holland, and their natural bloom time is January through March. Exactly when the flowers will open is impossible to predict. The best strategy is to

choose a number of different varieties and plant them 3 to 4 weeks apart during November, December and January. This way you will always have flowers coming into bloom.

Plan a winter filled with amaryllis blossoms by referring to Longfield Gardens’ article, longfield-gardens.com/article/When-Will-Your-Amaryllis-Bloom, for insight on when different amaryllis varieties will bloom.

Start your indoor flower display with an early bloomer such as Evergreen, which is always quick to break out of dormancy. Its flowers have narrow, lime/chartreuse petals on 20-inch plants. Enjoy the impressive display as each bulb produces two stems with four to six blooms.

Minerva’s extra-large, cherry-red flowers have a white star in the middle and an apple green throat. They are eye-catching from afar and spectacular up close. Apple Blossom is a long-time favorite with snow-white petals brushed with pink and a lime green throat. Or grow a double amaryllis such as Double King with layers of burgundy-red petals and up to a dozen flowers.

Enjoy some of the more unusual amaryllis colors and flower styles by planting varieties such as Naranja, with its tropical red-orange blossoms or Sweet Nymph, a romantic double amaryllis with stunning, coral-pink petals. Add elegance to your indoor garden with Picotee. Its 8” flowers are white with a thin red line around each petal.

As winter turns to early spring, celebrate with an explosion of indoor blooms from Red Pearl, Spartacus and other proven performers. The velvety, burgundy-red flowers of Red Pearl have a deep maroon throat that sets off the glittering gold stamens. Spartacus turns heads with its crimson petals and bold white stripes.

Display your amaryllis on a mantle, kitchen counter or entryway table where you can watch the amazing show as the first sprout appears, followed by buds and the spectacular trumpet-shaped blooms. Amaryllis are also beautiful, long-lasting cut flowers.

For best selection, order your bulbs early and store them in a cool, dry, dark place until you are ready to plant. Once you pot up the bulbs and place them in a warm, bright location, flower buds should appear in about six to 10 weeks.

Protect yourself from the winter blahs by investing in amaryllis. You can count on their big flowers and bright colors to lift your spirits and ease your way to spring.

Robert P. Beauregard, 88



SHREWSBURY — A valiant and emotionally-charged bid to spring a first-round upset on Shrewsbury High in the Central/West Division 1 Tournament came up just short for the Shepherd Hill Regional varsity volleyball team.

The Rams, after dropping the first set, came back to win the next two sets

and take a 2-1 lead, only to have the Colonials regroup, rebound and win the last two games to win the match, 3-2.

With the win seventh-seeded Shrewsbury (17-4) advanced to the quarterfinal round of the tournament where it played 18-0 Hopkinton High, the No. 2 seed, on Monday, Nov. 4. Shepherd Hill, the No. 10 seed, finished its season 12-9. Shrewsbury

won the two regular-season meetings between the schools, 3-2 on Sept. 6, and 3-0 on Oct. 4.

Set scores of the match were 25-12, 21-25, 21-25, 25-12 and 16-14.

“We played our hearts out,” said assistant coach Tony Wong-Li, who was handling the head coaching duties because head coach Chris Lindstrom was not able to attend the game. “I have a huge sense of pride in this team just watching the way they battled back after dropping the first set.

“We’ve had a lot of injuries this year,” continued Wong-Li, who seemed devastated by the loss. “This was only our third match this year with all our starters playing. We’ve come a long way.”

After appearing lethargic and overwhelmed in the first set, the Rams rebounded in the second game to tie the match, 1-1.

Shepherd Hill, its intensity level having been turned up a few notches, took the lead for good in the set at 3-2. Senior Kiley Wong-Li, coach Wong-Li’s daughter, paced an aggressive Rams’ attack with four of her eight kills coming in this set. Sophomore Annaka Lindstrom closed out the second-set victory with an emphatic kill.

“I think we were dealing with some nerves in the first set because it was a District match,” Shepherd Hill senior captain Maddi Hughes said. “But once we realized that we wanted it really bad we fought for it.

“We didn’t do anything in the second and third set that we weren’t doing in the first, we just got our energy up,” Hughes continued. “We play best when we’re excited and between game one and two Kiley and I got the team really fired up; we got our energy up to where it should be.”

Shepherd Hill had to come from behind in the third set for the win, trailing for much of the action before finally taking the lead for good, 20-19, on a kill by Isabella Sousa. The Rams secured the win and grabbed a 2-1 lead in the match when a spike attempt by Shrewsbury’s Charlotte Coskie was blocked at the net by Lindstrom and sophomore Alyse Biron (two kills, three blocks in the match).

The Rams led briefly in the fourth set, 2-0, but the Colonials quickly took charge, going ahead 3-2 and cruising to the double-digit win, which set the stage for a dramatic fifth set.

Shepherd Hill, behind the serving of Lindstrom (eight service points in the match), who hit four straight service winners, took a 5-1 lead in the fifth set. The Rams, behind the play of Kiley Wong-Li (two kills) and Lindstrom (a kill) continued to lead and were ahead, 13-11, when the Colonials made their match-winning push.

A pair of Shepherd Hill errors tied the game at 13-13. Shrewsbury went ahead, 14-13, on a kill by Emma Brady, but the Rams came right back, Kiley Wong-Li tying the game, 14-14, by first digging out a spike attempt by Coskie and then coming back to tap a floater

over the net and into an open area. The Colonials went ahead, 15-14 on a service error by the Rams, and then won the game and the match on a kill by Coskie.

Hughes said she felt the way her team rallied and pushed Shrewsbury to the brink of elimination showed who they really were.

“We’ve been underestimated a lot this year,” Hughes said. “I think winning the second game proved to [Shrewsbury] we were going to fight; we weren’t going to let them win like that. We fought for it the entire match and that’s all we could ask. I’m very proud of my team, definitely.”

Pearl Harbor casualty to be honored in Spencer

SPENCER – After going unidentified for more than seven decades, a Spencer sailor killed during the attacks on Pearl Harbor will be honored this month at a memorial service.

U.S. Navy Buglemaster 2nd Class Lionel Lescault was on the deck of the USS Oklahoma on Dec. 7, 1941, when the ship was attacked by Japanese forces. Lescault and his comrades were getting ready to play the morning colors aboard the battleship as part of the band. At just before 8 a.m., the first of nine torpedoes struck the ship from multiple Japanese aircraft, resulting in the deaths of 429 crew members and the capsizing of the ship.

Unidentifiable at the time, Lescault's remains were buried at National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific in Honolulu, as well as those of more than 300 fellow crew members from the Oklahoma. Lescault and his comrades went unidentified for decades, but closure was finally brought to many of their families 74 years later, when the graves were disinterred in 2015. Thanks to modern DNA technologies, Lescault was identified and members of his family were contacted.

"It means a lot to be able to honor him," said Lescault's nephew, Robert Berthiaume, of Spencer, who is organizing a memorial program in town next month.

On Nov. 10, a ceremony will be held at Powder Mill Park at 1 p.m. A plaque will be dedicated to honor the life of Lionel Lescault, who was 29 years old when he died. He was born in Spencer, and later lived in Worcester before enlisting in the Navy.

Lescault was buried at Arlington National Cemetery earlier this year. His name will be added to the memorial rotunda at Spencer Town Hall within the next year.

For Berthiaume, who never knew his uncle was born in Spencer, it means a lot

Honoring all heroes this Veteran’s Day

Veteran’s Day, which is celebrated annually on November 11, commemorates the hardworking men and women who sacrifice their time and put themselves in harm’s way to defend the country’s core values of freedom and opportunity. While Veteran’s Day certainly is a chance to honor those who have donned the uniform during wars and military installments, it also can be a chance to recognize the unsung heroes of wartime — those who step into roles so that soldiers and strategists can focus their attention elsewhere.

Take for example Naomi Parker Fraley. In 1942, Fraley was a machine shop worker at the Naval Air Station in Alameda, Calif. She was one of scores women who worked in factories and shipyards during World War II, helping to produce munitions and war supplies. Parker was 20 years old in 1942 and served as the inspiration for what would become one of the most indelible images of the era, known as “Rosie the Riveter.” Parker unknowingly inspired the iconic image after she was photographed at work bent over

an industrial machine in a jumpsuit with her hair tied back in a polka-dot bandana. In 2018, Naomi Parker Fraley died at the age of 96, not nearly the household name she perhaps should have been.

Rosie the Riveter helped to tout the contributions of female war employees who were defending America by working on the homefront. Rosie was a successful morale-booster, and some may be surprised to learn that Rosie has various incarnations.


Norman Rockwell’s depiction of a female riveter, which appeared on the cover of the Saturday Evening Post on May 29, 1943, became an iconic staple of that time. Muscular, with a rivet gun on her lap, a sandwich in hand and a boot stomping on a copy of “Mein Kampf” — and timed perfectly to coincide with the release of a song called “Rosie the Riveter” by Redd Evans and John Jacob Loeb — Rosie became a household name. But another Rosie image actually predates Rockwell’s Post cover.

Naomi Parker Fraley was reportedly the inspira-


tion for an ad created by a lesser known artist named J. Howard Miller. Miller produced a “We Can Do It!” poster for Westinghouse Electric in 1942 aimed at boosting spirits among the company’s workers. The poster helped to recruit new female personnel, according to scholar James J. Kimble. This Rosie was portrayed in a red bandana with her bent arm flexed, rolling up her shirtsleeve.

Both Miller’s and Rockwell’s depictions of female war workers became ingrained in popular culture. Rockwell’s cover art was eventually loaned to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for use in war bond drives for the duration of the war. Miller’s version has been emulated for generations and still epitomizes a strong female presence in the workforce.


This Veteran’s Day is a prime time to delve into American wartime history, with interesting stories like the origins of Rosie the Riveter, and pay homage to all of the heroes that help ensure America’s reputation as a great nation.

to discover a fascinating chapter in his family's history. Several other members of the family also served in various branches of the military.

In addition to Lescault, 23 other Spencer residents made the ultimate sacrifice in the Second World War. Berthiaume enjoys tracing the history of his uncle and meeting others whose family members served.

"If you think about it, he was likely the first person from Spencer to be killed in World War II," Berthiaume said. "It is important for me to share his story with people."

Berthiaume, a member of the Spencer Exchange Club since the eighties, has done extensive research on Lescault's life and military service. He continues to seek naval records that will shine a brighter light on the service of Spencer's latest World War II hero.


The Nov. 10 ceremony at Powder Mill Park is open to the public. Town and regional officials will join in the celebration of Lescault's life and sacrifice.

Was Missing 3½ Years

WEBSTER, March 11 — The War Department has informed Mrs. Roger (Kozicz) Meagher, 18 George street, that her husband, First Lt. Roger F. Meagher, 32, was killed in action Korea on Nov. 3, 1950.

Mrs. Meagher said this morning he had been reported missing on Nov. 2, 1950. His death occurred during combat operations in the Unsan area in North Korea.

He also leaves two sons, Michael John, 10, and Brian William, 7; his mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Meagher, of Norfolk, Va.; a brother, Henry Meagher Webster, and three sisters, Mrs. Bernice Cregg and Mrs. Ellen Capozzoli of Webster and Mrs. Hazel Dion of Norfolk, Va.

Lt. Meagher served in Europe during World War II as a warrant officer. He re-entered Army service in 1948 as a lieutenant after serving as commanding officer of the Webster National Guard unit.

Explore the history of Veteran’s Day

Service members make numerous sacrifices in defense of their countries. While the debts to service members may never be the kind that can be repaid in full, paying tribute to veterans, on Veteran’s Day and throughout the year, can be a great way to show them just how much their efforts are appreciated.

VETERAN’S DAY BEGINS WITH ARMISTICE DAY

Veteran’s Day is a byproduct of the end of World War I, when Germany and the Allied Nations signed the Treaty of Versailles, formally ceasing fighting and establishing terms of peace. On November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the signing of the treaty, the

first Armistice Day events were held. Armistice Day was initially a legal holiday to honor the end of World War I only, states History.com. The United States Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and November 11 became a national holiday starting in 1938. However, in 1954, after the country had been embroiled in both World War II and the Korean War, Congress amended the Act of 1938 by renaming the commemoration “Veteran’s Day” to honor veterans of all wars.

VETERAN’S DAY IN OCTOBER?

According to Military.com, for a short time, thanks to the Uniform Holiday Bill, which in 1968 established three-day weekends for federal employees by celebrating national holidays on Mondays, Veteran’s Day was moved to the fourth Monday of October — the first being October 25, 1971. However, many people did not agree with this decision, continuing to honor the holiday on the original date. In 1975, President Gerald Ford signed a new law that returned Veteran’s Day to November 11 beginning in 1978. Since then, parades, memorial



events, volunteer efforts, and other celebrations revolving around veterans have been held on November 11.

VETERANS AROUND THE WORLD

Many countries, including the United States, celebrate veterans on or near November 11. America’s closest neighbor to the north, Canada, commemorates veterans on Remembrance Day (also November 11), as does the United Kingdom. Britain also has Remembrance Sunday, which is the second Sunday of November. Remembrance Day also is called Poppy Day, when people of the Commonwealth member states wear a red poppy flower in honor of military members who have

died in the line of duty.

PAYING TRIBUTE

There are various ways to honor veterans on Veteran’s Day and Remembrance Day. Federal government closings, educational efforts in schools, parades, and visits to military hospitals or cemeteries may take place. In Europe, it is common to observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. every November 11. Veteran’s Day and its sister holidays mark the honoring of veterans of all wars, with a particular focus on living veterans. It is a day to celebrate the dedication and selflessness of hardworking military men and women.




