Featured

The bridges of Carroll County.

Covered bridges have long been many a photographer's subject and source of pleasure to bridge aficionados who are drawn to the history the bridges represent, particularly in New England, where a quarter of remaining covered bridges can be found.

In the mid-1990's, the ongoing romance surrounding these structures hit its peak with the publication of the novel "The Bridges of Madison County," which was later adapted to film by Clint Eastwood. Alas, no Clint Eastwood or Meryl Streep characters will be featured here. Instead, we offer a few facts and then a tour of five of these structures found right here in the Mt. Washington Valley, and where they will lead you.

Covered bridges are sometimes referred to as "kissing bridges"

— an old what you might call "urban legend" claimed that the protection of the roof and sides kept wooing couples safe from prying eyes as they stole a kiss. The more mundane reasons are simply that the covering protected the bridges, and they lasted longer. Also, in early days, the bridges were crossed by horse-drawn vehicles and livestock which were less skittish crossing rushing waters with the added protection of sides to the bridge. That is also the reason many were painted red to resemble a barn and soothe the animals.

So, on to the tour, starting at the southerly end in search of the Albany Bridge. It is located just off the Kancamagus Highway, approximately six miles from Conway. Built in 1857, it was destroyed in a windstorm in 1858 (so much for lasting longer!) and immediately rebuilt. I found crossing this bridge the most interesting, as from this entrance, it appears you are driving directly into a wall of stone. However, a quick right at the end of the bridge takes you on a delightful ride along a narrow winding road often covered with a leafy canopy as tree limbs cross and meet above you. Fishing sites and camping areas are available at the beginning of the road which eventually drops you onto the southern end of West Side Road in Conway.

Hang a right, and you will soon come to both the Swift River Bridge and the Saco River Bridge to your left. Close together,

they were once joined in an unfortunately dramatic way. The Swift was first built in 1850, and provided access to the north along the West Side Road. In the spring of 1858, a huge storm with raging waters lifted the bridge off its foundation and sent it flying downstream, where it crashed into the Saco River Bridge and knocked it off its moorings. Breaking apart, both bridges ended up two miles downstream. Rebuilt in 1890, the current Swift River Bridge is made up of much of the lumber from both destroyed bridges. The Swift was bypassed in 1974 when a modern concrete and steel bridge was built. Now closed to vehicular traffic, it provides an excellent chance for a leisurely crossing on foot to enjoy its beauty and take pictures with no distraction of traffic.

A stone's throw down the road, the 1870 rebuilt Saco River Bridge takes you on a shortcut from West Side to Route 16. At its northerly end is Davis Park Recreation area with tennis courts, basketball court and a small beach area. Parking is free.

Should you choose to stay a bit off the beaten path, pick up West Side Road again in Conway and follow it all the way to the Bartlett and onto Route 302. Along the way, you have many options. Don't miss a stop at Weston's Farm stand for local produce (especially the corn!). Horseback riding is available at The Farm

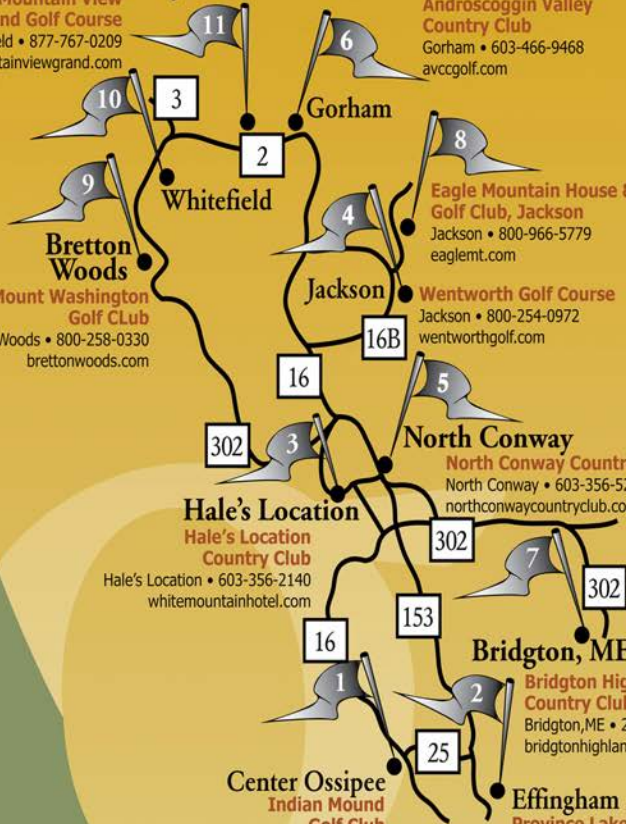

by the River Bed and Breakfast; side trip to the White Mt. Hotel for a bite, a beverage while looking across at Mt. Cranmore; perhaps take a side trip to Echo Lake for a dip or a drive up Cathedral Ledge for an awesome view. Once you've taken your left toward Bartlett you might stop for a short hike up to the waterfall at Diana's Baths on the N. Conway/Bartlett town line. A word to the wise...keep an eye on your speedometer on West Side....this is a leisurely tour so let the person in a hurry pass...you could very possibly see him later on the side of the road as the recipient of "a blue light salute!"

You've reached Route 302 in Bartlett, and taking a right, within a very short distance you will see on your left the Covered Bridge House Bed and Breakfast and the Covered Bridge Shoppe located in the Bartlett Covered Bridge, originally built in 1851. Spanning the Saco River, this bridge was abandoned in 1939. Rebuilt in 1950, for a time it was used to store snow fences. Sold in 1965, eventually, a gift and antique shop were built inside. The long entrance to the shop gives you the feel of the original structure, and the river view is outstanding. The shop itself has everything the shop-a-holic could want, starting with the many decorative flags that line the entrance and including gifts and memorabilia far too extensive to mention — maybe you need a redneck margarita glass? This was my first visit, and I know I'll be back!

On to the last on our tour...The Jackson, or "Honeymoon Bridge," just off of Route 16 and the entrance to Jackson Village. Built in 1876, with a walkway added in 1930, this is probably the most photographed bridge in the area. Serving as the entrance to Jackson Village, crossing it will lead you along "the loop," which is home to many places of interest. Start with Flossie's Gift Shop (check out the small hanging hot air balloons) just across the bridge; sidetrack to Nestlenook Inn for horseback riding; continue on for a stop at Raven Wood Curio Shoppe, where the limitless garden statuary and quaint building will draw you in; enjoy the art at the Photo Gallery; purchase a puzzle at White Mt. Puzzles, flowers at Bloemen Winkel; side trip up Carter Notch

Road to get amazing pictures at Jackson Falls; check out the Eagle Mt. House at the top of the road, The Wentworth at the bottom, the Snowflake Inn across from the Wildcat and Christmas Farm Inn just up 16B for possible future stays. Worked up an appetite? Take your pick among the Wildcat Tavern, Yesterday's, Back Country Bakery and Cafe, the J Town Deli and finally, at the end of the loop, take an immediate right and up the hill to the every popular Shannon Door Pub. Toward the end of the loop, a glance to your left will reveal the "unofficial" off road covered bridge on Wentworth Golf Course. Rumor has it that this covered structure was built after an overly enthusiastic golfer drove his cart off the then rickety old plank crossing and into the river... nothing injured but pride!

That is your tour, should you decide to take it...park your car, walk across these bridges, enjoy the views, feel the history and maybe, just maybe, steal a kiss! ❖

Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society

Bartlett Village was, at one time, the center of railroad activity in the eastern White Mountains. Bartlett was also the site of a large sawmill and a logging railroad which traveled over Bear Notch and down into the Swift River valley. The Bartlett Land & Lumber Company was formed by lumbermen from around Portland, Maine in the early 1870's. The logging railroads began in 1887 with the granting of a charter for the Bartlett & Albany Railroad to construct a southern rail from Bartlett to the Swift River at Passaconaway.

The Bartlett & Albany Railroad operated only one locomotive and one trip per day was all that engine could handle, hauling supplies to the logging camps and returning over Bear Notch with a load of log cars. The Bartlett Roundhouse was constructed

in 1887 by the Portland & Ogdensburg Railroad. It is believed to be the last all wooden structured Roundhouse to be built by the P&O. A roundhouse is a building used by railroads for servicing locomotives. They are generally large, circular or semicircular structures located near or adjacent to turntables. The defining feature of the traditional roundhouse was the turntable, which made access easier when the building was used for repair or storage of locomotives. In 1888, the P&O was leased to the Maine Central Railroad for 999 years, and that company continued to add on and improve the facilities.

Bartlett Railroad historians tell us, "The Portland & Ogdensburg Railroad was a railroad planned to connect Portland, Maine to Ogdensburg, New York. The plan never came to fruition and,

in 1880, the Vermont section was reorganized and leased by the Boston & Lowell Railroad. Several years later, the Maine and New Hampshire sections became the Portland & Ogdensburg Railway. That part was leased to the Maine Central Railroad in 1888, and in 1912 the Maine Central leased the eastern part of the Vermont section from the Boston & Maine Railroad, the successor to the B&L.”

Early steam engines were usually designed to travel forward only. Reverse operations capabilities were soon built into the mechanisms, but the controls were optimized for forward travel. A turntable allowed a locomotive or other rolling stock to be turned around for the return journey. The Bartlett Roundhouse was built to replace a smaller structure that was moved across the tracks and used by the bridging company of the P&O and Maine Central. At the time of its completion the then six-stall Roundhouse and out buildings were considered “State of the Art” with even a new air driven Iron turntable measuring 65 feet installed near the front of the Roundhouse.

The Roundhouse was open seven days a week, 365 days a year, and was staffed by a workforce of about 50, working three tricks, each trick eight hours long. The Roundhouse had coal derricks, sanding and service facilities and a 17,500-gallon water tank. In

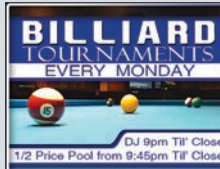

1913, Stall 1 was lengthened to 105 feet to accommodate the new 95' long articulated locomotives purchased from the Boston & Maine. A wye, or triangular junction, was also constructed and the turntable was removed and switches took their place because of the articulated locomotives length. Before the wye, all locomotives were turned on the turntable at Bartlett. Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society President, Scotty Mallett, confides, "The back wall of the Roundhouse had to be fixed several times as accidents do happen and locomotives either backed or ran through the back of the Roundhouse."

The years of operation during WWII pushed the facility to the maximum but after the War service began to decline and there was talk of closing the Roundhouse. In 1958, Passenger Service ended on the Maine Central, the

Roundhouse was closed and, the following year, it was sold to the State of New Hampshire for use as a highway salt and sand storage depot. In 2005, the Roundhouse was slated for demolition, as its condition became more decayed, but a group of interested rail fans and citizens met at Conway Scenic Railroad in 2006 to form a club to help save the structure. Talks with the State of

New Hampshire, Department of Transportation began and, in March 2008, The Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Club was formed as a 501 (c) (3) organization to help work with the State to save the historic building.

The Club became a Society in 2013, but its purpose remains "to save and facilitate restoration of the former Portland & Ogdensburg/Maine Central roundhouse located

on the famed Mountain Division." In August 2008, the BRH-PC successfully got the roundhouse listed on the State of New Hampshire State Registry of Historic Places. Currently the group is cleaning up debris and trash around the structure so that it may be made accessible for contractor estimates and further volunteer labor. The biggest item on their wish list at present is a

seasoned Grant Writer with a passion for preserving history. Society members are from varied backgrounds but all share a passion for local history. Conway Scenic Railroad Operations Manager Paul Hallett says "I am a member of the Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society because I feel that it is important to save tangible pieces of the past so that they can be used as teaching tools for the future. I believe that when most people drive through Bartlett, today they have absolutely no idea that Bartlett is on the map because of the railroad... This Roundhouse is one of the last vestiges of the once extensive railroad facilities that were at Bartlett. We need to know about our history and so do our kids and grandkids! It's hard to know where you are going if you don't know where you've already been."

In the Mount Washington Valley

Art In the Park

The Mount Washington Valley has long been a destination for artists; Benjamin Champney's "White Mountain School of the Arts" welcoming such famous names as Shapleigh, Cole, and Daughty. Friends and fellow artists from the Hudson River School and beyond traveled to the Valley in the summer to paint "en plein." Artists who lived in the Valley welcomed these guests and shared their works in roadside studios and art shows on the lawn. More than 400 artists are credited with painting images of the Mount Washington Valley in the 1800's. The works of local photographers and crafters were also presented for visitors to enjoy and purchase.

Some scholars believe that by the turn of that century, "the era for White Mountain art had ended," but the Mount Washington Valley Arts Association tells a much different story. The Valley continues to inspire well-known painters, but local art has expanded to include numerous unique creations. Celebrating many of these mediums is the annual Art in the Park festival, held each summer in Schouler Park, in the center of North Conway Village. What began, on the lawn of the Eastern Slope Inn, as the North Conway Art Outdoor Exhibit has grown into this hugely anticipated event, described by organizers as "a fine Art Show with the Valley's Best Artists."

Visit Schouler Park on Saturday, Aug. 9 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for 2014's Art in the Park festival. Browse the spacious white tents and find that perfect art piece for that special place in your home. "Whether your interest is contemporary or classic art, it is all here," says one Arts Association board member. Because the event is also an Art Show, there are awards presented. In 2013, Best of Show and First Place in Painting and Drawing was awarded to Ernie Brown, First Place in Fine Crafts to Robin Cornwell,

First Place in Three-Dimensional Art to Joe Keller and Heather MacLeod, and First Place in Photography to Joe Viger. Drop in and support your favorite artist!

A portion of the mission for the Mount Washington Valley Arts Association is "To promote an understanding and appreciation of the rich artistic history of the MWV region from the 1800's to the present." Art in the Park accomplishes this by offering Legacy Art from such renowned artists as David Baker, Robert DeJulio, Clara Walsh and Nan White. For those who enjoy a modern twist to their art, numerous "unique" artists display their creativity under the tents, as well. There is always something new and exciting.
